

ORDINANCE NO. 1426 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1125.01 CODIFIED ORDINANCES
CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto concurring,

SECTION 1. That Section 1125.01 of the Codified Ordinances reads as follows:

SECTION 1125.01 ESTABLISHED; COMPOSITION; QUORUM.

"There is established within the City, a Plumbing Board which shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by Council, and shall serve for terms of three years each, ending on December 31 in the third year, and until their successors have been duly appointed. Each member of the Board shall be a citizen of the United States, and each appointed member thereof shall have been a resident of the City for not less than one year immediately preceding his appointment. No member, as such, of the Board shall receive any compensation.

A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. No decision or determination of the Board shall be effective unless concurred in by a majority of the members thereof. The Board may choose such officer from its own membership as it sees fit."

be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1125.01 ESTABLISHED; COMPOSITION; QUORUM.


"There is established within the City Government a Plumbing Board which shall consist of five members, as follows: Three licensed master plumbers, one disinterested person, and one person who shall be a representative of the City. Members shall be appointed by Council and shall serve for terms of three years each; except for the first appointment, where two members shall be appointed for three years, two members for two years, and the remaining member for one year. Terms shall end on December 31. Each member of the Board shall be a citizen of the United States, and each appointed member thereof shall be a resident of the City. No member, as such, of the Board shall receive any compensation.


A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. No decision of determination of the Board shall be effective unless concurred by a majority of the members thereof. The Board may choose such officers from its own membership as it sees fit."

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect from and after the earliest date provided by law.
