

ORDINANCE NO. 1453 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE EMPLOYING WILLIAM A. BLUNDEN AND ROBERT
A. BARCLAY, ARCHITECTS, FOR PLANS AND CONSTRUCTION
OF A POLICE STATION FOR THE CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Oberlin has determined that
a new Police Station is necessary for said City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of
Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto
concurring:


SECTION 1. William A. Blunden and Robert A. Barclay, Archi-
tects, are herewith employed as architects for preliminary architectural
services in the planning and building of a new Police Station *in accordance
with preliminary Schemes 3, subsections A, B and C dated April, 1979*, for a
fee not to exceed Four Thosand Dollars (\$4,000.00).

SECTION 2. In the event that construction plans proceed, said
Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) shall be applied towards the total
architect fee.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest
date allowed by law.
