AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING BIDS FOR CHEMICALS USED IN WATER TREATMENT AND WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANTS OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO, FOR THE YEAR 1983 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the following being the lowest and best bids for certain chemicals used by the Water Treatment Plant for water treatment and by the Waste Water Treatment Plant for waste water treatment, for the year 1983, are hereby accepted, and the City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract accordingly:
