

ORDINANCE NO. 1824 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN ALTERNATE METHOD OF
APPORTIONMENT OF THE UNDIVIDED LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND
OF LORAIN COUNTY

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 5747.53 provides that the county budget commission may provide for the apportionment of the undivided local government fund of the county under an alternate method upon the approval of certain governmental units; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oberlin, Ohio, is desirous of cooperating with governmental entities throughout Lorain County in adopting a formula and alternative method of apportionment that is fair and equitable to all parties concerned.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, a majority of members elected thereto concurring:


SECTION 1. That the formula proposed by the ad hoc committee for the local government fund attached hereto as Exhibit A is hereby approved by the City of Oberlin for its proportionate share.

SECTION 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.

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EXHIBIT A

1. Each subdivision will receive ninety (90) percent of their 1984 distribution, said ninety (90) percent to serve as the "base" allocation;
2. The remaining ten (10) percent of the local government funds earmarked for the subdivisions are added to any increase in local government funds earmarked for the subdivisions;
3. The new formula, dividing funds based upon population (.60), assessed value (.25), and roads (.15), is used to divide the funds in Number 2 above;
4. A subdivision's allocation for 1985 and thereafter will be the sum of Number 1 above [ninety (90) percent of 1984 allocation] and Number 3 above [ten (10) percent of 1984] plus any increase in funds earmarked for the subdivision.
