

RESOLUTION NO. R86-9 CMS

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING PRIORITIES OF ALLOCATION
IN THE 1987 FEDERAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Oberlin, Ohio, City Council agrees that the federal budget deficit must be reduced, and,

WHEREAS, this City Council is aware of the varied opinions concerning the priorities for services and certain funds, and,

WHEREAS, the Oberlin City Council opposes the ranking of military allocations as the highest priorities in the federal budget, taking precedence over economic and health needs of our citizens, and,

WHEREAS, the federal government by such prioritizing places unreasonable burdens on state, county, and local governments which could result in widespread disparities in vital services and programs in all of these levels of government,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oberlin City Council supports the United State Senators and Representatives to Congress who oppose military assistance to the "Contra" forces fighting to overthrow the government of Nicaragua, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the United States government work closely and sincerely with the nations of Central and South America who are seeking peaceful solutions to conflicts there through the Contradora process, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the United States government invite representatives of all foreign nations currently involved in Central and South America to meet with officials from these nations in an effort to secure peace for the citizens of these strife-torn nations.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
