

ORDINANCE NO. 90-80 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE REJECTING ALL BIDS RECEIVED FOR THE
CONSTRUCTION OF A WATER DISTRIBUTION BUILDING FOR THE
CITY OF OBERLIN WATER DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That all bids received by the City of Oberlin, Ohio and opened on October 17, 1990, for the proposed construction of a Water Distribution Building for the City of Oberlin Water Department are hereby rejected.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"to reject unacceptable bids for a proposed Public Works project at the earliest possible date"

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
