

RESOLUTION NO. R91-1 CMS

A RESOLUTION SUBMITTING THE QUESTION OF AN ADDITIONAL  
TAX LEVY FOR CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE  
OBERLIN PUBLIC LIBRARY PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE  
SECTION 5705.23 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Oberlin Public Library, a public library supported by the City of Oberlin, has submitted to the Council of the City of Oberlin by Resolution adopted November 14, 1990, by a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of all of its members, a request that this Council submit to the electors residing within the boundaries of the Oberlin Library District the question of an additional tax levy of three mills for current expenses of the Oberlin Public Library, and,

WHEREAS, Section 5705.23 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes and directs this Council to submit to a vote of the electors of said District said additional tax levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby declared that the amount of taxes that may be raised within the ten mill limitation are insufficient to provide for the necessary requirements of the Oberlin Public Library and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of that limitation for the purpose of providing additional funds to meet the current expenses of the Oberlin public Library at a rate not exceeding three mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$.30 for each one hundred dollars of valuation for each of the years 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995.

SECTION 2. That said levy is an additional tax levy for five years for the purpose of providing additional funds to meet the current expenses of the Oberlin Public Library, in accordance with Section 5705.23 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That said levy shall be placed upon the ballot for submission to the electors residing within the boundaries of the Oberlin Library District, as defined by the State Library Board pursuant to section 3375.01 of the Ohio Revised Code, the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May of 1991, being May 7, 1991.

SECTION 4. That said levy shall be placed upon the tax list of the current year, if a majority of electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof.

SECTION 5. That the Interim Clerk of Council of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, be and is hereby directed to certify a true copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections, Lorain County, Elyria, Ohio, prior to the 21st day of February, 1991 and notify said Board

of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax be given as required by law.

SECTION 6. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 7. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to-wit:

"to meet the time requirements of Section 5705.21 of the Ohio Revised Code and to provide the funds necessary for the continuing operation of the public library"

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
