## ORDINANCE NO. 92-92 AC CMS

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A DOWNTOWN ADVISORY COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby established a Downtown Advisory Commission for the City of Oberlin, Ohio. The Commission shall be composed of five (5) individuals selected by Council, in accordance with Section XIX of the City Charter, representing the following groups:

- 1.) Merchants Association and/or Oberlin Area Chamber of Commerce
- 2.) Off-Street Parking, Inc., and/or Downtown Parking Interest
- 3.) Downtown Building Owner
- 4.) Downtown Business Owner
- 5.) City Resident

SECTION 2. The purpose of the Commission shall be to provide recommendations to the City Council and City Manager in the following areas:

- 1.) Provide leadership on matters which impact the central business district (CBD).
- 2.) Create a common image for CBD.
- 3.) Conduct costs benefit analysis of proposed legislation and requirements for the CBD. Assist with financing alternatives.
- 4.) Ensure CBD interaction with other boards, commissions, and organizations.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.
