ORDINANCE NO. 93-86 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING THAT A REAL AND PRESENT EMERGENCY EXISTS IN REGARD TO THE OBERLIN SANITATION DEPARTMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH ROAD MACHINERY SALES, INC., OF AVON LAKE, OHIO, FOR THE REPAIR OF A SANITATION TRUCK PACKER BODY

WHEREAS, on or about November 14, 1993, a sanitation truck suffered serious mechanical breakdown; and,

WHEREAS, if said sanitation truck is not immediately repaired the safe and efficient operation of the Sanitation Department is in jeopardy; and,

WHEREAS, the failure of said sanitation truck represents a serious threat to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Oberlin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to enter in a contract with Road Machinery Sales, Inc., of Avon Lake, Ohio, for the furnishing of repairs to the Unit 418 sanitation truck at the Oberlin Sanitation Department, said contract to be in an amount not to exceed \$21,000.00.

SECTION 2. That the immediate need for said sanitation truck repair is hereby declared to constitute a real and present emergency arising in connection with the safe and efficient operation of the Oberlin Sanitation Department, pursuant to Section 735.051 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"to ensure the continued safe and efficient operation of the Oberlin Sanitation Department"

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
