## ORDINANCE NO. 95-39 AC CMS

## AN ORDINANCE DECLARING CERTAIN MUNICIPALLY OWNED REAL PROPERTY SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SOLICIT COMPETITIVE BIDS FOR THE SALE OF SAME

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the real property and adjacent land owned by the City of Oberlin described in the attached "Exhibit A" is hereby declared to be surplus and not necessary or needed for any current municipal purpose.

SECTION 2. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to advertise said property for sale and solicit competitive bids for the sale of same.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its subcommittees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.
