

ORDINANCE NO. 98-50 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A TAX BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO,
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1999,
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the proposed tax budget for the City of Oberlin, Ohio, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 1999, a copy of which is attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference, is hereby adopted and approved, and the City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file two copies of same with the Lorain County Auditor prior to July 20, 1998.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"to ensure the Tax Budget is filed with the County Auditor by the deadline",

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
