

ORDINANCE NO. 98-66 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO 97-113 AC CMS, THE 1998 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. To provide for the anticipated expenses for the City of Oberlin, State of Ohio, for the Fiscal year 1998 commencing on January 1, 1998, the following appropriations be and are hereby authorized and allowed as of that effective date:
