ORDINANCE NO. 99-62 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH 32 FORD MERCURY, INC., OF BATAVIA, OHIO, THROUGH THE STATE OFFICE OF PURCHASING FOR THE PURCHASE OF A F-350 FORD CA8/CHASSIS WITH A DUMP BODY, SNOW PLOW AND BALL/PINTLE HITCH FOR THE OBERLIN MUNICIPAL LIGHT & POWER SYSTEM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lordin, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 125.04 and City of Oberlin Resolution No. R88-7, the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with 32 Ford Mercury, Inc., of Batavia, Ohio, for the purchase of α F-350 Ford cab/chassis with a dump body, snow plow and ball/pintle hitch for the Oberlin Municipal Light & Power System for a purchase price of \$35,190.00, plus a \$500.00 delivery charge to Johnson's Driveway Service.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"to authorize the purchase of a truck with snow plow for the Oberlin Municipal Light & Power System as soon as possible to ensure the efficient operation of the Oberlin Municipal Light & Power System and protection and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin", and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
