A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, STATE OF OHIO, FOR SALARY REIMBURSEMENT FUNDS FOR THE CITY OF OBERLIN D.A.R.E. PROGRAM PERSONNEL TIME AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a grant agreement with the Office of Attorney General, State of Ohio, for salary reimbursement funds for City of Oberlin D.A.R.E. program personnel time.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"in order to allow timely application for funding, the deadline for which is January 1, 2000,"

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.

- a.) operating an existing DARE program; or
- b.) planning to implement a new DARE program; or
- c.) planning to expand an existing DARE program; and
- d.) employs and/or plans to employ one or more certified DARE officers; and
- e.) must be working in conjunction with a local school district; and
- f.) must document that at least 50% of the applicant's budget is received from sources other than the grant awarded by the Office of the Attorney General.

III. Fund Availability

Announcements of grant awards to applicant agencies will be made in the fall of 1997. All applications received before June 30, 1997 will remain active for the entire grant year (July 1, 1997-June 30, 1998).

IV. Funding Priorities

The main categories of need have been determined to be as follows and shall be considered as the top three priorities for grant awards:

- * Law enforcement agencies who have a DARE program but are in jeopardy of losing the program due to budget constraints;
- * Law enforcement agencies who do not have a DARE program but will start a new program in their jurisdiction;
- * Law enforcement agencies who have a DARE program and would like to expand the program to include more schools and more students.

V. Application Procedure

The application form following this section is the official document to be used in applying for DARE Grants funds available through the Attorney General's DARE Grants office. In addition to the information provided in the application form, each application package for funding must include the following information:

- (1) evidence that the applicant agency has a DARE program established or plans to establish a DARE program and is a local law enforcement agency;
- (2) a signed copy of the official resolution authorizing the local government to apply for, and if awarded, enter into agreement to administer a DARE grant through the Office of the Attorney General;
