

ORDINANCE NO. 00-24 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF ACCORDIA-POTTINGER AND COMPANY OF DAYTON, OHIO, FOR GENERAL LIABILITY, LAW ENFORCEMENT LIABILITY, PUBLIC OFFICIALS LIABILITY, FIREMEN'S ERRORS & OMISSIONS LIABILITY, AND AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE CITY OF OBERLIN AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the proposal of the following insurance company and its agent supply certain insurance coverage for the City of Oberlin, be and the same is hereby accepted, and the City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract accordingly:


