SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute the attached Participation Agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for the participation of the City of Oberlin in the Ohio Department of Transportation's contract for Sodium Chloride (rock salt).

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"to authorize a participation agreement with the State of Ohio prior to its expiration and to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department", and shall take effect immediately upon passage.

A participating Political Subdivision cannot change its position during this contract period. Termination of participation is effective upon the expiration date of the contract. Failure of a Political Subdivision to purchase its requirements from the awarded vendor shall invalidate participation for the following winter season.
