AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO FILE A JOINT APPLICATION WITH THE NEW RUSSIA TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO THE DISTRICT 9 PUBLIC WORKS INTEGRATING COMMITTEE FOR OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION ISSUE II FUNDING AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to file a joint application with the New Russia Township Board of Trustees to the District 9 Public Works Integrating Committee for Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) Issue II Round 17 funding for the following project:

### East Hamilton Street Resurfacing

SECTION 2. That the City of Oberlin hereby agrees that the New Russia Township Board of Trustees shall be designated "Lead Agency" for the purposes of this OPWC Issue II Round 17 project.

SECTION 3. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a co-operation agreement with the New Russia Township Board of Trustees for the purposes of administering this Issue II Round 17 project only.

SECTION 4. That the City of Oberlin hereby agrees that it said Issue II Round 17 project is funded, the City of Oberlin will provide matching funds in the proportions as designated in the grant application.

SECTION 5. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to wit:

"in order to allow for the completion of the grant application in a timely manner", and shall take effect immediately upon passage.

The City developed a joint Issue II application with New Russia Township to resurface and make drainage improvements to East Hamilton Street from Rt. 58 east to the intersection with Oberlin-Elyria Rd. (old US 20). New Russia Township is the lead agency for the proposed project since about 64% of the project is in the township. The City budgeted \$28,051 in the 2003 Capital Budget and an amount just under \$8,000 per year for 10 years for a proposed 0% interest OPWC loan for the remainder of our share.

This project is on hold for the 2003 construction year since the application was not approved for funding. We met with New Russia Township Dick Williams and with Assistant Lorain County Engineer, John Hamilton several weeks ago about the possibility of modifying our application to improve the likelihood of (unding The options included requesting 100% loan funding (rather than the proposed mix of grant and loan) or increasing the amount of the local match.

Although the City was prepared to consider either of these as viable options, New Russia Township was not willing to do so. Since approximately 2/3rds of the project is in the township, their potential additional cost was roughly twice ours. John Hamilton suggested that if the City and Township were to re-apply for the same project in the 2004 funding cycle, it was highly likely that it would be recommended and approved for funding.

The long and short of it is that we will not be pursuing the construction of the proposed improvements to East Hamilton St. in 2003. Assuming the Township is still willing and interested, this project will be re-submitted for Issue II funding in Round 18.

# COOPERATION AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF NEW RUSSIA AND THE CITY OF OBERLIN

This Agreement, by and between the Township of New Russia, County of Lorain, State of Ohio (hereinafter referred to as "Township") and the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio (hereinafter referred to as "City"), is hereby entered into on this 3rd day of September, 2002.

Whereas, the Township and the City intend to file a joint application to the Ohio Public Works Commission (hereinafter referred to as "OPWC") for Issue II Round 17 funding for the project known as "East Hamilton Rd. Reconstruction"; and

Whereas, the OPWC requires that the parties submitting a joint application for funding enter into a "Cooperation Agreement".

Now, therefore, both parties do hereby mutually agree as follows

#### 1. Lead Agency

The City does hereby authorize the Township to be the lead applicant and, as such, to sign all necessary documents

## 2. Project Financing

- a. The Township will provide funds totaling 63.54% of the cost of the project. Said funds will come from the <u>General</u>, <u>Gasoline Tax</u>, <u>and/or Road & Bridge</u> funds. Furthermore, the Township agrees to pay its 63.54% of the cost as invoices are due/at the end of the project/as otherwise agreed upon.
- b. The City will provide funds totaling 36.46% of the cost of the project Said funds will come from the <u>Capital Improvement</u> fund. Furthermore, the City agrees to pay its 36.46% of the cost as invoices are due/at the end of the project/as otherwise agreed upon

#### 3. Project Authorization

- a This project is authorized by New Russia Township Resolution Number 2002-08-10
- This project is authorized by City of Oberlin Ordinance Number 02-94 AC CMS.

4. Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall commence at the latest date set forth below. This Agreement shall be commensurate with the term of the OPWC grant award

Successors and Assigns

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Township and the City. This Agreement and its rights and responsibilities shall not be assigned or transferred without the prior written consent of the Township and of the City.

6. Severability

If any section of this Agreement is found to be illegal, unconstitutional, improper or unenforceable, said section shall not affect the enforceability of the remainder of this Agreement.

7. Jurisdiction

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio.

Please find attached our application for Ohio Public Works Commission Issue II Round 17 (FY2003) funding. This is a joint application with New Russia Township to resurface and make drainage improvements to East Hamilton Street from Rt. 58 east to the intersection with Oberlin-Elyria Rd. (old US 20). The majority (approximately 64% by cost estimate) of this project is located in New Russia Township. Therefore, NRT is the designated "Lead Agency" for the purposes of the application.

This application has been prepared by NRT Clerk, Elame King and me. The cost estimates have been prepared by the Lorain County Engineer's Office- we received them yesterday. The entire cost of the project is estimated to be \$295,913. NRT has agreed to apply for 50% of OPWC project funding, an amount equal to \$109.488 as a 12 year no-interest loan. This will enhance the probability of a successful application. If successful, the City would effectively receive an OPWC grant for \$79,839; the local fund match is estimated to be \$28,052. This will be reflected in our 2003 Capital Budget request.

There is a "Co-operation Agreement" with New Russia Township for this project which specifically references the cost share percentages- this is reflected in the language of the Ordinance. It is anticipated that the New Russia Township trustees will also approve authorizing legislation on September 3<sup>rd</sup>. This application is due on September 6, 2002 so we respectfully request passage on emergency. If there are any questions, please contact me.
