Duke Energy in Florida




Duke Energy (NYSE: DUK), a Fortune 150 company headquartered in Charlotte, N.C., is one of America's largest energy holding companies and a top renewable energy provider.

Its electric utilities serve 7.9 million customers in North Carolina, South Carolina, Florida, Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky, and collectively own 51,000 megawatts of energy capacity. Its natural gas unit serves 1.6 million customers in North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Ohio and Kentucky.

Duke Energy's clean energy strategy includes goals of at least a 50% carbon reduction by 2030 and net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.

Duke Energy began serving customers in Florida more than a century ago – and at the very foundation of our company is a commitment to serve our customers and communities.

- Serving Florida since 1899.
- We serve approximately 1.9 million retail accounts, bringing electricity to more than 4 million people and businesses in 35 counties.
- 13,000 service territory square miles.
- Approximately 5,200 miles of transmission lines. Distribution system includes approximately 18,000 miles of overhead distribution and approximately 14,000 circuit miles of underground distribution cable.
- 22 power generation sites capable of producing approximately 11,000 megawatts of electricity.
