Regional Overview:

Strong presence in the region

- More than 100 Gulfstream aircraft based in the Middle East
 - Largest fleets in Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates
- More than 25 G650 / G650ER aircraft based in the region

All-New G500 and G600:

Best-in-class aircraft to enter service in 2018 / 2018

- Enhanced performance capabilities for both aircraft
 - G500: 5,200 nm / 9,630 km at Mach 0.85*
 - G500: 4,400 nm / 8,149 km at Mach 0.90*
 - G600: 6,500 nm / 12,038 km at Mach 0.85*
 - G600: 5,100 nm / 9,445 km at Mach 0.90*
- New Gulfstream Symmetry Flight Deck™ with Active Control Sidesticks (ACS) – first for the industry
- Five G500 flight-test aircraft have more than 1,040 flights, accumulating more than 3,850 flight-test hours
- Five G600 flight-test aircraft have more than 275 flights, accumulating more than 1,125 flight-test hours
- G500 has reached 53,000 feet and Mach 0.995; G600 has reach 53,000 ft and Mach 0.999

- Special mission applications include medevac, atmospheric research, conformal airborne early warning, maritime patrol and surveillance, executive airlift, command and control (C2) and intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance (ISR)
