UC Berkeley Beverage Alliance Impacts Campus Zero Waste Goal

(Berkeley, CA) The University of California, Berkeley signed a ten-year beverage contract with PepsiCo in 2011. The contract is managed through a partnership between PepsiCo and the UC Berkeley Beverage Alliance. The Beverage Alliance includes representation from Cal Dining, Residential and Student Service Program, Intercollegiate Athletics, the ASUC Auxiliary, and the Department of Recreational Sports.

In acknowledgment of UC Berkeley's commitment to sustainability, PepsiCo generously committed \$15,000 per year for sustainability-related campus projects. The funding for each annual project is determined by the Beverage Alliance Sustainability Grant Committee, which includes staff and student representation from The Green Initiative Fund, Campus Recycling and Refuse Services, and the Office of Sustainability.

2011-2013 Funding Priorities

The Committee identified standardizing the interior and exterior recycling collection bins and signage, and increasing education and outreach to the campus community as the two main priorities for the 2011 - 2013 academic years. The funding provided the purchase and installation of thirteen (13) Max-R waste and recycling units that were to be placed strategically throughout the UC Berkeley campus.


Campus Impact and Reactions

According to Katherine Walsh, Coordinator of UC Berkeley's The Green Initiative Fund, the installation of the Max-R units is helping the University make progress towards a goal of zero waste by 2020. It is expected that bottles, cans, compost, and mixed paper rates have increased while landfill rates have decreased.
