GENERAL:

What is changing at CNN Newssource Digital?

We are enhancing the Video Affiliate Network (VAN) in a few ways:

- More powerful HTML5 video player with faster load speeds (P.S. it's the same one CNN.com uses today)
- New analytics dashboard with 24/7 real time video analytics for publishers and producers
- Upgraded infrastructure delivering better compatibility with various browsers and ad specs
- Clear mapping of Newssource portal categories to VAN category feeds

Why is CNN Newssource Digital making these changes?

First and foremost, to provide a better experience for our VAN affiliates. We want to make it easier and faster for you to publish videos, and we want to bring more visibility into video performance for our publishers and producers.

When will these features launch?

The new features will become widely available starting Tuesday, Nov. 13.

Will the CNN Newssource website look different?

Nothing is changing about the Newssource website, except the addition of “**Video Analytics**” under the “I Want To” drop-down box. The process for embedding VAN videos from the website will be the same, except using a new player and new embed codes starting Nov. 13.

Are any additional features coming next year?

Yes! We plan to add more useful features to the analytics dashboard in 2019, including revenue metrics for VAN videos, more configurable player settings and the ability to sell your own ads. We will keep you posted on upcoming changes along the way.

EMBEDDING VIDEOS FROM NEWSOURCE WEBSITE:

What will change when I embed videos from the Newsource website?

The embed code itself will change; however the process to embed videos from the website will not change. Within the embed code, the “zone ID” will replace the “affiliate ID” and the structure of the video ID will be different.

What happens to videos I've already embedded prior to Nov 13?

Any single videos you have embedded prior to Nov 13 will map automatically to the new embed codes on the backend – you will not need to do anything. All VAN videos will continue to expire after 30 days, which has not changed from today's practice.

What happens to playlists and keywords feeds I've already embedded prior to Nov 13?

Any playlists or keyword feeds you have embedded prior to Nov 13 will map automatically to the new embed codes on the backend, so these feeds will continue

to work. However, please take the time to re-embed the keyword feeds and playlists with the new codes no later than January 15, 2019, as we will retire the old infrastructure at that time. Any old embed codes will no longer work after that date.

We take the VAN embed code into our CMS as a template, and simply change the video ID each time, instead of re-embedding each time. Will that still work starting Nov. 13?

Your process remains 99% the same – you just need to start using the new embed code.

Specifically there are the 3 differences in the new code:

1. “Video ID” will now be “Data-GUID”.
2. “Data_affiliate” will now be “Zone ID”. This ID is unique to each affiliate: please email jessica.burns@turner.com to get your code.

3. The “Data-GUID” (formerly video ID) will need to be URL encoded prior to being inserted into the rest of the embed code.

Example:

Code from Newsource website:

Video ID=van/batchfeed/2018/10/31/katu_a54ea500-dd35-11e8-8855-6db23bd05516

Encoded and ready for use:

Data-GUIDs=van%2Fbatchfeed%2F2018%2F10%2F31%2Fkatu_a54ea500-dd35-11e8-8855-6db23bd05516

MRSS FEEDS:

I currently use MRSS feed(s) to ingest CNN Newsource Digital content. Will the feeds I receive change?

Yes, the feed URL will change. There will be minor changes in the feed structure and values. You need to contact us to get the new URL and credentials: please email jessica.burns@turner.com

What is the difference between the new and old feeds?

First, determine which feed you are currently receiving: **Article Feed**, **Video Feed** or **Bundle Feed**. Below are the differences, with examples of the old vs. new feeds.

Article (with Images) Feed

- New Article feed does not have "RT-" as a prefix to the guid
- New Article feed does not have [CDATA] on "headline" and "mobile headline"
- New Article feed has "scheme" and "label" attributes, but they're blank
- New Article feed has a different date format for "firstModifiedDate" and "firstPublishDate" --> YYYY-MM-DDTZ instead of "Mon, DD Mon YYYY GMT"
- New Article feed does not have highlights
- New Article feed does not have parentheses for the "dateline"

Video or Bundle Feed

- New bundle feed has a different date format for "updateDate", "pubDate" (YYYY-MM-DDTZ instead of Tue, DD MON YYYY GMT)

- New bundle feed duration is in milliseconds as opposed to seconds
- New bundle has "scheme" and "label" attributes that are always blank
- **For Bundle Feed Only: will only contain videos that have an associated article*

Are there any enhancements to the feeds?

You will now see URLs directly linking to images, not zip files.

What is the process to get the new feeds I need to change in my system?

You will need to manually add the new feed and set it up as you did with the current feeds. We will begin sending out new feed URLs to affiliates starting the week of November 5th. Be on the lookout for an email with your new feed URL(s). If you do not receive your feed, or you would like to receive it earlier, reach out to us at NewsSourceDigital@cnn.com

What if I run into problems with the new feeds?

WORDPRESS PLUGIN

I use the Wordpress plugin. Is there anything changing?

ANALYTICS:

What analytics will be available?

In this launch, video performance analytics will now be available (revenue metrics will come shortly into 2019). You will be able to view video analytics from both the “Producer” and “Publisher” lens. In the Producer view, you will see metrics for each video you have syndicated via the CNN VAN, if applicable. In the Publisher view, you will see metrics for each video you have published. You will have a “summary” view, which is a roll-up, and a “videos” view, which details the performance of individual videos.

Are they real-time?

As close to real-time as possible - within a couple of minutes.

Where can I access the new analytics?

Log into the NewsSource Website. In the upper left, under the “I Want To” drop-down, you will see “view video analytics”. This will open a new window with the new analytics dashboard.

What are the definitions for each term?
