
Workshop Overview

The second community workshop for the Marietta Transit Center Site Selection Study took place on November 2nd, 2023 at the Cobb County Civic Center. More than 10 community members attended and participated in the workshop and provided feedback on the project. The workshop was facilitated in an open house format where participants participated in various stations to learn about the project background and future tasks, as well as completed activities to provide project input. It should be noted that a project survey for the Marietta Transit Center was also on-going at the time of the community workshop. The workshop activities were developed to capture the same input as the survey questions. Input from both the workshop and survey will be used to inform the project. The results and feedback received from the workshop activities are summarized in the following sections by activity. Photos from the workshop are provided below.










Workshop Activities and Feedback

Study Area Travel Activity

Workshop participants were able to provide their travel origins (trip starting points) and destinations (trip ends points) within the study area and greater Cobb County area by placing pins on a map. The results from this activity and the survey results will be used to understand where people typically travel to and from within the Marietta study area. The results of the Study Area Travel activity are provided in **Figure 1**.

Transit Center Amenities Activity

Workshop participants provided their feedback on the types of transit center features and amenities to prioritize in the design of the Marietta Transit Center. The activity results are summarized in **Table 1** and an image of the activity board is provided in **Figure 2**.

Transit Center Site Evaluation Priorities Activity

Workshop participants provided feedback on their priorities for the transit center site evaluation process for the Marietta Transit Center. Accessibility was the highest ranked priority by those present at the meeting with three dots placed on the board under that evaluation criteria. Operational was the second highest priority with two dots. The results of the activity are provided in **Table 2**. The resulting activity board is provided in **Figure 3**.

Figure 3: Site Evaluation Priority Activity Results




Transit Center Location Activity

Workshop participants were able to review the initial site selection process results for the Marietta Transit Center and provide feedback on their preferred and not preferred site locations. Based on input provided during the workshop, participants favored Zones B and S, due to site proximity to where some participants currently live and proximity to US Highway 41, respectively. Zones J, K, L, M, P, Q, R, and S were each referred to as unpreferred zones as they were noted to be "too far away". The results of the activity are summarized in **Table 3** and are shown in **Figure 4**.
