Senior Services Honored for Tackling Food Insecurity






Cobb County Public Library is the State's 2023 Library of the Year



The library serves a population of over 750,000 across 15 branches and is dedicated to being a resource center in the community by providing equal access to information, materials, and services.

Cobb County Mourns a Giant, Former County Manager



Mr. David Hankerson began his career in Cobb County Government in 1984 and served as manager of the Community Development Department before he was appointed Cobb County Manager on Feb. 1, 1993. He held that position for 24 years and shepherded county government as it moved from a mixed suburban/rural area to a rapidly growing metropolitan county.

Following his retirement, David Hankerson expressed to the Atlanta Journal-Constitution, "I never hated to come to work for Cobb; I couldn't wait. I was always here early, always here late." Those who collaborated with him recognize this as almost an understatement.

David Hankerson His final appearance before the Board of Commissioners occurred in September 2022, marking the county's 25th year of maintaining a triple AAA rating. Hankerson emphasized that achieving this goal was a priority during his tenure as county manager, and the county successfully attained the triple AAA rating just a few years later. "Triple AAA is about financing, but it's more than just financing," remarked Hankerson. "It's about leadership, community relations, and business relationships. We were very proud of that triple AAA rating."

Hankerson's extensive involvement included being a Leadership Cobb Alumnus, a graduate of the Regional Leadership Institute, and a member of various committees and boards, such as the Association County Commissioners of Georgia General Government and Natural Resources and Environmental Policy Committees.

He served on civic and professional boards, including the Environmental Advisory Council, the ICMA Client Advisory Forum, The Walker School Board of Directors, and The Strand Board of Directors.

Hankerson received numerous awards throughout his career, including the Excellence in Public Service Award in 2004, the Justice Robert Benham Award in 2005, and the Community Leader of the Year award in 2008. The Safety Village Education Building was named in his honor by the Board of Commissioners in July 2009. In 2010, he received the Marietta Daily Journal Citizen of the Year, 100 Black Men of North Metro Image Award, and the Cobb NAACP Hugh Grogan Political Action Award.

After a long illness, Mr. Hankerson passed away on Jan. 26 at the age of 77. Thank you, Mr. Hankerson, for your service and leadership to Cobb County, and for paving the way for those who have followed in your footsteps.

Additional Funding for South Cobb Regional Trailhead

The Georgia Board of Natural Resources put its stamp of approval on funding for 13 land conservation, restoration, and parks projects across the state, including \$3 million for the Chattahoochee RiverLands Regional Trailhead in South Cobb. The \$3 million awarded to the project is allocated specifically for the development of a park at the corner of Mableton Parkway and Discovery Boulevard.

This project will be transformational for the area and will improve our quality of life by providing access to one of Georgia's greatest natural resources. Connecting with nature will have a positive impact on the physical and mental health of residents and visitors.

BOC Approves Transit Pilot Program in South Cobb

Cobb to Implement Transit Pilot Program in South Cobb



The Board of Commissioners approved a nearly \$3.5 million micro-transit pilot program in South Cobb as part of preparations for November's transit tax referendum. The two-year program, mainly funded by state and federal dollars, with the county covering 30% of the costs, aims to provide localized on-demand transit services connecting to other transit services in Cobb County and the Atlanta region. Microtransit was included in the proposed 30-year, 1% sales tax to fund public transit improvements in Cobb, which had envisioned 108 miles of bus rapid transit (BRT) and arterial rapid transit (ART) routes.

The county applied for state funding to support the pilot program, and there are plans to potentially extend it beyond the initial two years with the Georgia Transit Trust Fund and Federal Transportation Administration funding covering a significant portion of the costs. *Photo credit: Marietta Daily Journal*

BOC Urges State Leaders to Continue Mental Health Reform



The Cobb County Board of Commissioners recently adopted a resolution urging Gov. Brian Kemp and the General Assembly to continue mental health reform efforts this legislative session. The effort to have each county adopt a resolution specifically urging the Governor and General Assembly to continue efforts to enhance citizens' access to vital mental health services – including the provision of state budgetary funding for additional behavioral health crisis centers across the state.

Cooper Middle School Students Win Big



Congratulations to five students from Cooper Middle School for earning the opportunity to participate in the 2023-24 Georgia State Model Water Tower Competition (MWTC) after securing top spots in the Cobb-Marietta competition. The MWTC is an annual event open to all Cobb County and City of Marietta middle schools. Participants construct functional model water towers using recycled materials and are evaluated based on presentation, hydraulic function, dimensions and materials.

The top three models received cash prizes, with \$300 awarded to first place (The Beatles – Andrew M.), \$200 to second place (Team Happy Meal – Ida C., Olivia M., Cailyn S. and Mia B.), and \$100 to third place (Team Snowman – Wilnide C., Erin F., Ada T. and Ariel). Teams were also recognized for best engineering design, artistic design and presentation. Congratulations to all the students who participated in the 2023-24 Cobb-Marietta MWTC.

Board of Commissioners Recognizes Great Leaders



The center's significance lies in its role as a focal point for community engagement and well-being, offering vital recreational

Families in Cobb Celebrate Having a Home and Stability



The Cobb County Board of Commissioners, in partnership with The Center for Family Resources and Cobb County Magistrate Court, launched a Housing Stability Court Program to promote housing stability. On May 10, the program celebrated its first set of graduates, marking a significant milestone for eight families who faced eviction.

This innovative court program, funded by \$1.3 million from the federal Emergency Rental Assistance program, diverts eligible families from traditional court proceedings, providing essential resources and financial education to enhance their stability. Chief Magistrate Judge Brendan Murphy emphasized the holistic approach of the program, which combines education, resources, and financial aid to ensure families can continue paying rent independently. The project will transform a 103-room motel in Mableton into 95 lease-ready apartments for qualified veterans, offering permanent housing, and essential support services while fostering a sense of community. Cobb's Continuing Excellence in County Financials







Cobb County and Trust for Public Land Hosting Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Chattahoochee RiverLands First Riverside Trail in South Cobb County

On Monday, December 2, the Cobb County Department of Transportation and Cobb PARKS, in partnership with Trust for Public Land, will hold a ribbon-cutting ceremony to open the first phase of the Chattahoochee RiverLands.

The first section of this river trail brings a bold regional vision to fruition. It will connect 19 metro Atlanta cities and seven counties to the Chattahoochee River and to each other with a greenway trail of connecting parks, overlooks, access points, and trailheads. The site also offers the first-ever public access to the river in South Cobb County.

Key features along the 0.6-mile trail include a paved shared-use path, a boardwalk that spans scenic wetlands, a soft surface trail, an education nook, a river overlook, and more.

The Cobb County Department of Transportation led the project, with pivotal support from Commissioner Monique Sheffield, who secured \$1 million in SPLOST funds to kickstart the initiative. Trust for Public Land contributed an additional \$470,000 to help complete the project. Chairwoman Lisa Cupid and the Mableton Improvement Coalition have also been instrumental advocates, rallying community support throughout the process.

This project is a significant milestone for Cobb County and the metro Atlanta region as it sets the standard for the envisioned 100-mile linear park system of the Chattahoochee RiverLands. Once complete, the RiverLands will connect nearly one million nearby residents and visitors to nature and activities such as kayaking, swimming, biking, picnicking, walking, camping, and more along the river. This river trail, located in Mableton, sits behind Discovery Park at the River Line, and will be maintained by Cobb PARKS. 


brings me immense joy to share in the holiday spirit and brighten the season for our senior community.

McEachern is Perfect


