To enhance the value of member utilities to their communities by supplying reliable, cost-effective, long-term energy and energy services in a fiscally responsible and environmentally sensitive manner.

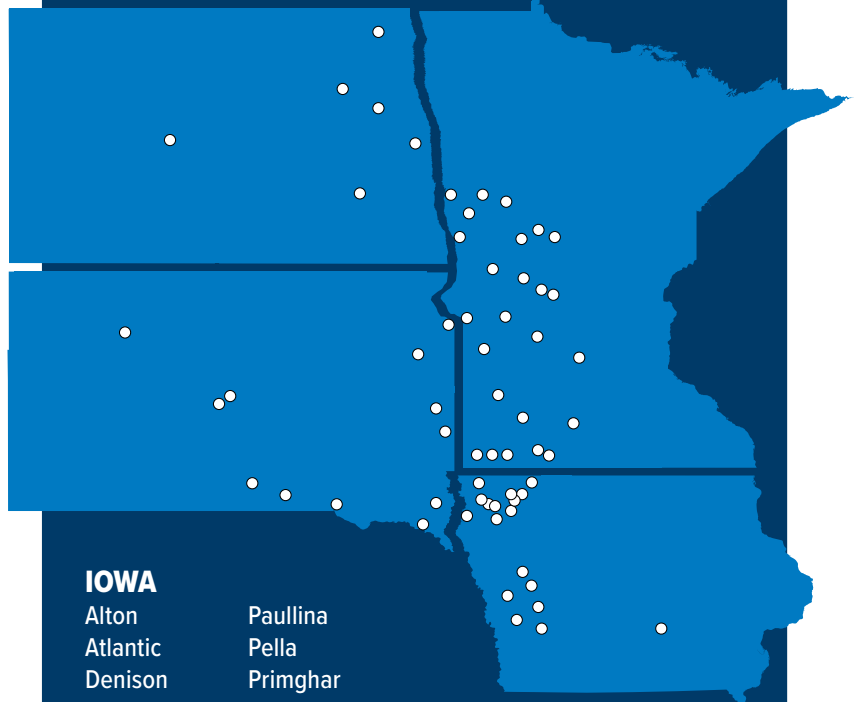
## OUR CORE VALUES

## Western Minnesota Municipal Power Agency

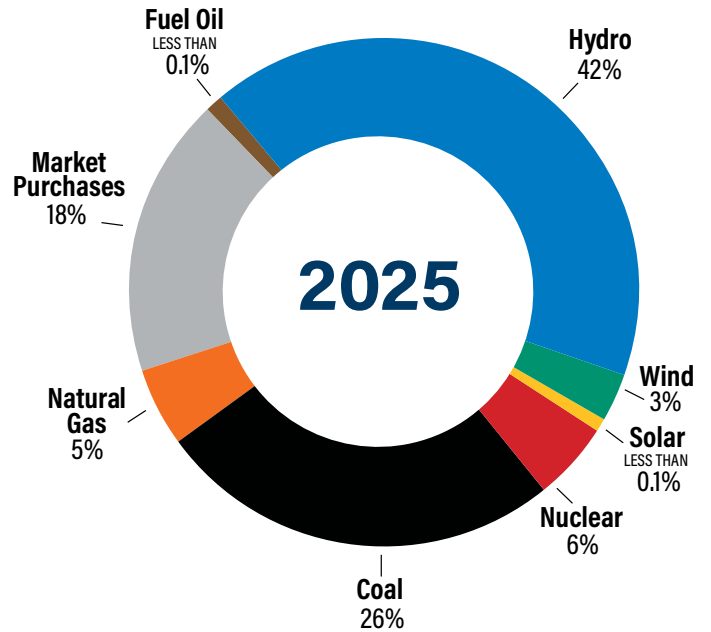
Western Minnesota Municipal Power Agency (WMPA) is the financing arm of MRES and owns the generation and transmission facilities that are used to serve MRES members. Through a power supply contract, MRES is entitled to the output of WMPA-owned facilities. In return, MRES provides administrative services on behalf of WMPA.

## OUR DIVERSIFIED POWER SUPPLY

MRES has built a diverse portfolio of generation resources to reduce risk, increase reliability and focus on environmental stewardship. Our members also are supplied by hydropower from the federal government's Western Area Power Administration (WAPA).
