



Wedding Information and Guidelines

Welcome and Statement of Purpose

When this congregation was established in 1925 and the sanctuary was dedicated in 1928, the primary purpose was for “the members of this church to be Christians only and to offer themselves in unselfish service to all the people of Atlanta for the glory of God.” This purpose continues today in the hope that couples that are both members and non-members will choose to have their Christian wedding ceremony in the sacred beauty of our building. The members and staff of Peachtree Christian Church welcome you in planning a wedding in our facilities. This is an important ministry of our church, which seeks to extend the grace and love of God to you.

The marriage ceremony in this church is an act of Christian worship. It is not merely a social occasion, but a service in which a man and a woman receive from God the gift of marriage. In this covenant they vow to be always faithful to each other and to God. They therefore receive assurance that God will provide them with spiritual gifts of love, joy, peace, courage, patience, truthfulness, and forgiveness that will sustain their marriage all the days of their lives.

By coming to the church for your wedding, you are saying that you want this happy and sacred ceremony and the life that shall follow to be lived in the presence of God. We, therefore, will do all we can to help you make this a high, holy, beautiful and lasting experience.

We want to extend every possible courtesy to wedding parties and assist in maintaining the high standards associated with weddings in this church. In order to make available to inquiring bridal parties the accepted customs of the church, the following guidelines are presented. If you have any questions or special requests regarding these guidelines, please feel free to discuss them with your officiating minister at Peachtree or Peachtree’s Wedding Coordinator.

We wish you all the happiness in your life together and sincerely hope that your wedding in our church will be a sacred and beautiful occasion.

Wedding Times

Weddings are held on Saturdays between 11am and 6pm or on Sundays between 2pm and 6pm. Friday weddings are available provided the calendar allows.

Late fall and winter weddings are encouraged to choose a ceremony time of 5pm at the latest for optimum color in the Sanctuary's stained glass.

Holiday weekend weddings require special approval and will require additional fees. Please contact Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator to inquire about holiday availability and additional fees applied to those dates. Peachtree does not allow weddings on weekends which include Christmas Eve, Christmas, or Easter.

Rehearsals for Saturday weddings are held the Friday evening before the wedding usually at 4pm or 5pm, though an earlier time can usually be accommodated. Rehearsals for Sunday weddings are held Saturday morning, the day before the wedding at 11am.

The total time allotted for a wedding (including pre and post wedding photography) is 3 ½ hours.

Wedding Day Timeline*

The timeline is as follows:

2 hours prior to contracted ceremony time: pre-wedding photography and prep.

Ceremony: 30-45 minutes

Post-wedding photography ends 1 hour and 15 minutes after contracted ceremony time.

15 Minutes allowed for exiting property.

*Should ceremony be longer due to additional music or speakers or if the wedding starts late, time will be subtracted from the post-wedding photography time. Please keep this in mind when planning your ceremony with your Peachtree Officiating Minister.

If you know ahead of time that you will need additional time for a longer ceremony/additional photography time, please inquire about the fee to lengthen the timeline. Time overages not paid for in advance will be deducted from the \$500 security deposit.

Wedding Fees

Our all-inclusive wedding package includes the Peachtree Christian Church Officiating Minister and premarital counseling; Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator and assistants; organist; use of church facilities for the rehearsal and wedding; bridal room; designated area for groomsmen; security guard; sound technician (sanctuary wedding only); custodian; utilities; and parking.

Sanctuary Wedding: \$3,800

Chapel Wedding: \$2,600

Additional fees that could be incurred should you choose to add these components to your wedding:

- Optional soloists and/or instrumentalists arranged through Peachtree's Minister of Music (cost determined by musicians)
- Printing of the available church wedding programs (see page 8) \$2 per program.
- Optional aisle marker candles \$300
- Optional live streaming Service \$100

A Date Reservation Fee equal to 50% of the total Wedding Fee, along with the completed signed contract is needed to reserve a wedding date/time. This Date Reservation Fee will be applied toward the Wedding Balance due. Weddings are booked on a first come first served basis.

Wedding Fees and a Security Deposit of \$500 are due 30 days before the wedding date, along with payment for any optional costs (additional musicians, programs, aisle markers, etc.) Late payments are subject to a \$100 late payment fee. Invoices will not be sent.

Security deposit is refunded in full 30 days after the wedding date. Exceptions: Damage, failure to leave things clean, alcohol on the premises or overage in rehearsal or wedding time. Overages in time are defined as an event starting more than 30 minutes late or lasting 30 minutes or longer than the reserved time. The amount of the deposit withheld will be determined by the cost of damages or the additional expenses of the extended time, including, but not limited to hourly rates of service providers whose time is extended (i.e., security, custodial, musician, etc.)

Wedding Refund Policy

If a wedding is cancelled by the Contracting Person (Bride, Groom or Family), the following schedule will determine the refund, if applicable to the party who paid the fee:

- If cancelled at least nine months prior: 100% of Date Reservation Fee is refundable
- If cancelled within six to nine months prior: 75% of Date Reservation Fee is refundable
- If cancelled within three to six months prior: 50% of Date Reservation Fee is refundable
- If cancelled within three months: Date Reservation Fee is non-refundable

Changes of Date do not constitute a cancellation, but are subject to a \$200 change fee and any changes in Wedding Fees for the new date will apply. In addition, if there is an approved date change, refund guidelines will be based on the original wedding date.

General Rules and Guidelines for Weddings and Rehearsals

Strict observance of the following rules is required:

- Alcoholic beverages are not permitted anywhere on church property, including the parking lot.
- Smoking and vaping are not permitted anywhere in the church building.
- The rehearsal and wedding will not be conducted when any member of the wedding party is under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.
- Outside food and beverages are not permitted in the Sanctuary or Chapel.
- All electronic devices are to be in the off position upon entering the Sanctuary.
- Vendors and Guests must abide by Peachtree's Photography Guidelines (see page 12)

Wedding Rehearsal

The date and hour of the rehearsal will be scheduled along with the wedding. The rehearsal is an integral part of the wedding and should proceed in a manner respectful of the bride, groom, and the place of worship. Only one hour will be set aside for the rehearsal. The rehearsal will begin promptly at the time scheduled and promptness is essential. Always anticipate traffic delays in Midtown Atlanta and give yourself extra time when traveling to the church. We encourage all members of the wedding party to arrive 30 minutes before the rehearsal time so that the rehearsal can begin on time. **Late starts or time overages will incur costs that will be subtracted from the Security Deposit.**

Your assigned Peachtree Minister will be in charge of the rehearsal. Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator and/or Wedding Assistants will assist during the rehearsal and will direct the wedding. If you have your own wedding coordinator, they are welcome to attend the rehearsal and observe and will be allowed time at the end of the rehearsal to make any needed announcements. Please review the guidelines for outside Wedding Coordinators on page 10 to understand their role at Peachtree rehearsals and weddings.

Guest Officiants are required to attend the rehearsal and should arrive early to meet with Peachtree's officiant.

Everyone in the wedding party along with parents of the couple should be present at the rehearsal if possible. Grandparents are not required, but welcome to attend. Ushers who will be seating Mothers should attend the rehearsal, as well as anyone reading scripture.

Any children attending the rehearsal must be accompanied by parents at all times and must remain seated when not rehearsing their portion of the ceremony.

The couple should deliver the marriage license to the Peachtree Minister at the time of the rehearsal.

Programs and any other personal items used in the ceremony (chalice, etc.) can be given to the Wedding Coordinator at the rehearsal and held until the wedding for you. If Peachtree is printing your program, we will have those available for you on the day of the wedding.

Officiating Minister & Premarital Counseling

The ministers and ministerial staff of Peachtree Christian Church consider it a sacred trust and privilege to participate in a Christian wedding ceremony. Our minister or approved representative is always in charge. The minister will direct the rehearsal and the wedding.

Our church seeks to provide ministry through premarital counseling to couples entering the covenant of marriage. These sessions are very helpful in preparing for one of life's greatest decisions and are a requirement for a marriage at Peachtree Christian Church.

After you have booked your wedding, Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will assign it to a Peachtree Christian Church Minister to officiate the wedding and provide you with their contact information. You will contact them to arrange times for your three premarital counseling sessions. It is the couple's responsibility to make sure this is scheduled and completed ahead of the wedding. Our ministers have designated office hours and couples will need to schedule around the minister's availability. The optimum time to meet is about 2-3 months out from your wedding date.

If you have a guest minister assisting with the ceremony, please provide their contact information to Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator AND your assigned Peachtree Minister as soon as possible so that they can get to know one another, and the Peachtree Minister can assign the portions of the ceremony that will fall to the guest minister. Please see the Guest Minister Guidelines (page 6) for more information on guest ministers co-officiating at Peachtree. Peachtree does not allow guest ministers to be the sole officiant at a wedding. Peachtree's ministers will always be the lead officiant at weddings but are happy to share the ceremony with a guest officiant.

Another required step in the counseling process is the music consultation. Although this is not a premarital counseling session, it is a key part of your wedding and it is your responsibility to schedule this session with Peachtree's Minister of Music. This session should be scheduled a minimum of 30 days prior to the ceremony, but ideally 2-3 months before the wedding. Please see the section on music (page 7) for more details.

Guest Minister Guidelines

Many non-member couples have ministers who have been meaningful in their lives and who want to be involved in this wonderful occasion. Peachtree welcomes those guest ministers to come and assist with weddings at Peachtree provided that it is understood by both the couple and the guest minister that the Peachtree Minister is always in complete charge and will direct both the rehearsal and the wedding. **Peachtree does not allow weddings in which guest ministers are the sole officiants.**

During the wedding, both the Peachtree Minister and guest minister will be robed and fitted with wireless microphones. They will stand side by side on the chancel and perform a shared and balanced ceremony following the standard Peachtree Weddings Order of Worship. The Peachtree Minister usually performs the more liturgical elements of the ceremony, and the guest minister usually performs the more personal elements, including the vows and rings and introduction of the couple at the end of the ceremony.

This division of the ceremony is discussed in your premarital counseling sessions. Contact information for the guest minister should be provided to your Peachtree officiant prior to beginning your counseling sessions. The division of the ceremony will be between the Peachtree Minister and the guest minister via phone or email. Further information will be given to the guest minister about rehearsal and ceremony arrival times, as well as other ministerial details by the officiating minister from Peachtree and the Wedding Coordinator from Peachtree.

It is very important that the guest minister understand that Peachtree weddings have a very strict timeline and that any time limitations given to them by the Peachtree Minister must be strictly adhered to so that your ceremony does not go over the time assigned for it. Please refer to the ceremony timeline (page 2) and make sure any guest ministers are aware of the consequences for time overages.

The following are the general guidelines for a ceremony with a guest minister and may vary depending on the assigned Peachtree Minister and their ceremony preferences.

- Invocation (Peachtree Minister)
- Affirmation of Marriage (Peachtree Minister)
- Declaration of Intent (Guest Minister)
- Presentation of the Bride (Guest Minister)
- Marriage Meditation and Personal Thoughts (Peachtree Minister)
- Exchange of Vows (Guest Minister)
- Giving of Rings (Guest Minister)
- Unity Candle Ceremony (Guest Minister)
- Celebration of Holy Communion (Peachtree Minister)
- Prayer of Blessing (Peachtree Minister)
- Announcement of Marriage (Guest Minister)
- Benediction (Peachtree Minister)

Should you wish your guest minister to sign your marriage license instead of Peachtree's Minister, the guest minister will be responsible for filing the document with the county after the wedding.

Wedding Music

Music is a vital part of your wedding ceremony. Music for your wedding should be chosen in consultation with our Minister of Music at least 30 days before your wedding. Those appointments can be scheduled by calling Rev. Jim Bell at 404-876-5535 ext 302 or by emailing jbell@peachtree.org.

Your wedding is a worship service and all music selected for the ceremony should be sacred and devotional in nature. Vocal music in particular should be unquestionably sacred. Vocal soloists and instrumentalists should be well trained and musically prepared. Should you have a guest vocalist or instrumentalist, it is their responsibility to provide us with two copies of the music that they plan to perform (in the appropriate key), one for themselves and one for the organist/pianist who will accompany them (unless they are bringing their own accompanist.) This should be done at least 3 weeks in advance of the rehearsal. Xerox copies are not permitted, as this is a violation of copyright laws. Musical rehearsals are scheduled one full hour before the wedding ceremony. The church can also provide you with qualified singers for a fee.

Peachtree's Organist (or pianist) is the only musician who is included in the wedding package. Vocalists or other musicians can be secured in consultation with the Minister of Music for an additional fee.

Our Sanctuary organ is one of the largest in the Southeast and is actually a compellation of two full organs in opposing galleries. Due to the complexity of the installation, guest organists are not allowed. Your wedding will be assigned to one of our talented staff organists.

Generally the prelude will begin about 20 minutes before the wedding. If your musical menu is complex and numerous musicians have been engaged, we will provide a full thirty minutes of prelude music.

Couples are encouraged to review the standard wedding selections on our wedding website prior to their music consultation with the music minister. Songs will need to be selected for the following:

- Mothers/Grandmothers Entrance
- Bridal Party Entrance
- Bride's Entrance
- Recessional

Although we encourage all music to be live, should you wish to have recorded music played, please discuss this with our music minister for approval of the songs. If approved, there is a \$150 fee to cover the additional Sound Technician costs. Appropriate Digital files will need to be shared with the Wedding Coordinator, Music Minister and Sound Technician.

Wedding Programs

If you would like Peachtree to create your programs, we are happy to provide them at a cost of \$2 per program. Our programs are on cream cardstock and include an illustration of the front stained glass window and altar area on the cover and information about Peachtree Christian Church on the back cover. A standard format for the order of worship, bridal party information, memory candle information, as well as a message from the couple and the reception information are on the inside.

Should couples wish to create their own wedding programs, Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator can assist them by providing a copy of our order of worship. Song selections should be made with the Music Minister prior to creating the program. Please keep a record of the selections chosen and their composers, so that you can include them in your program.

Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator must approve any wedding programs not created by our staff. Please provide a copy of your proof to the Wedding Coordinator prior to printing, so that she can review it for content and give approval or note necessary changes.

Please contact Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator with any questions about programs.

Dressing Rooms

The bride and her party will use the bridal room adjacent to the Narthex, which has its own restroom. The groom's party will assemble in the Chapel adjacent to the Narthex, with restrooms nearby. Should groomsmen need to dress before the wedding, our Library can be reserved for that purpose and the gentlemen can then move to the Chapel for assembly.

Furniture should not be moved in any of the rooms except when the professional photographer deems it necessary for pictures. If moved, all furniture should be returned to its original place in the room.

The church cannot be responsible for the delivery of tuxedos, dresses, food and flowers and cannot assume the safety of personal items (clothes, purses, etc.) brought to the church.

Security and Parking

The church provides designated wedding security in the form of an off duty Georgia State Patrol or Atlanta Police Department officer for every wedding booked. The officer will be on site two hours prior to the wedding and will remain until the wedding party and guests have cleared the property.

A spacious parking area, which can accommodate about 150 cars, is provided behind the church building. Access to the parking is from Spring Street at the southwest corner of the building. Parking is not allowed on the driveway from Peachtree Street because of fire code restrictions. **Vehicles must be moved after the ceremony and cannot remain in the Peachtree lot. Peachtree does not assume responsibility for the safety of vehicles or their contents while parked on church property.**

Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator and Assistants

Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will be your key contact for all things wedding at Peachtree. After booking your wedding, she will assign your officiating minister and provide their contact information to you as well as discuss the details of your ceremony with you through a comprehensive questionnaire. She is available throughout the time leading up to your wedding to answer any questions you might have about the wedding rehearsal or ceremony.

Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will staff the wedding with Wedding Assistants appropriate for your guest count, along with an organist, security officer, sound technician, custodians and other Peachtree personnel. She will facilitate set-up of the wedding per your requests (unity candle, memory candle, kneeling bench etc.) oversee staff, and direct the ceremony on the day of the wedding.

At the rehearsal, Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will assist Peachtree's Minister in directing the rehearsal, will make sure all attendants and family know their role at the wedding and answer any questions they might have.

On the day of the wedding, Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator and Assistant(s) will be present 2 hours prior to your ceremony time as you do any pre-wedding photography and prep. They will train the ushers and assist with the seating of any early family members. They will direct the wedding, keeping everyone on the timeline from 30 minutes before the ceremony up until the bridal party exits the building. During the wedding, they will act as hosts and hostesses for Peachtree Christian Church and will remain in the Narthex during the ceremony to greet and seat any late arrivals.

After the wedding, they will escort the bridal party to the desired post-wedding photo location and assist guests with exiting the church. They will remain through the post-wedding photo time and assist the bridal party in their exit before locking the building.

Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will file the signed marriage license with the appropriate county offices and mail a photocopy of the marriage license to the couple at that time.

Outside Wedding Planner/Coordinator Guidelines

Peachtree's Minister and Wedding Coordinator will be responsible for your rehearsal and ceremony as well as overseeing all wedding personnel at the church (organist, sound technician, etc.) Even with that, it's beneficial to you to have someone there helping you with your personal needs in the Bride's room/Groom's room, monitoring your outside vendors and keeping those vendors on their timeline leading up to ceremony time. For this reason, many brides wish to bring an outside planner or day-of coordinator.

Outside wedding planners and coordinators are welcome, but are not to interfere at the wedding rehearsal and the wedding. They are required to abide by the Peachtree Christian Church Wedding Policies and may function only under the direction of the Peachtree's Officiating Minister and Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator.

Peachtree's Minister and Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will direct the wedding rehearsal. Your coordinator is welcome to attend and observe the rehearsal and Peachtree's Minister will turn it over to them at the end to make announcements to help your wedding party prepare for the rehearsal dinner and wedding day.

On the day of the wedding, Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator will take over the timeline at 30 minutes before ceremony time and direct the wedding. She will turn the bridal party back over to any outside planner/coordinator or your photographer immediately following the ceremony. We will give a heads up to the planner or photographer as we near the departure deadline.

Should your planner have any questions about their role at Peachtree, please have them contact Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator.

Floral and Decor Guidelines

Listed on the National Register for Historic Places, our beautiful Sanctuary and Chapel require very little decoration. The church does not provide flowers for weddings, but will make available to you a list of florists that have previously prepared arrangements for the church.

Flowers are optional. Should you wish to have flowers, fresh flowers only (not silk) may be placed on the Altar in the Sanctuary and the Chapel. Two antique silver Altar urns are provided for the wedding flowers in the Sanctuary. The floral arrangements must be placed in liners or bowls that will fit into the altar urns. The silver urns are never removed from the altar except when there are to be no flowers on the Altar. The arrangements may be taken away following the wedding should you desire to use them at your reception. If you are taking the flowers away after the ceremony, please make sure your florist arrives to pick up the floral arrangements prior to the end of your timeline while the building is still open.

Measurements: The diameter of the Altar urns is 9" and the inside bottom is 4" above the Altar. The arrangements with liner should therefore not be higher than 36", so that when placed in the Altar urn, the top of the arrangement will be just below the arms of the cross on the Altar.

The church provides a prayer bench for use during the service, which is encouraged for all weddings. Candelabras and white candles are provided for all weddings if desired, as well as a Sterling Unity Candle Candelabra and a Memory Candle. There are 14 aisle marker candles that are also available for an additional fee of \$300.

Flowers and Décor plans other than Altar Flower Arrangements or Pew markers must be approved by Peachtree's Wedding Coordinator prior to the ceremony day.

Peachtree allows petals to be dropped by flower girls under the following conditions: 1. Artificial petals only (no real petals allowed) and 2. You must be willing to take on the responsibility of picking up the petals after the ceremony. If they are not removed, a custodial fee will be subtracted from your damage deposit.

Peachtree does not allow rice or birdseed to be thrown after weddings, either inside or outside the building. Sparklers are not allowed. Bubbles are allowed outside the building only. Rose petals (REAL) may be thrown outside for a \$150 custodial fee for cleanup afterward.

The following is a list of regulations that require full cooperation:

- No furnishings shall be moved.
- Aisle runners are not to be used.
- Candles are not permitted on the pews, standing at the end of the pews or in the sill of the windows.
- No tacks, pins, tape, nails or glues shall be used to fasten any decorations to the furniture or building.
- Only wrapped wire, padded clamps or ribbon may be used to attach bows, ferns or flowers to the pews
- No ferns, flowers or bows may be attached to the kneeling bench.

Holiday Décor

Peachtree is decorated during the Advent Season, through Epiphany Sunday in January. The decorations usually go up the weekend prior to Thanksgiving and remain through the first full week of January. Photos of the holiday decorations and the exact dates that the Holiday decorations will be present can be provided by request.

Photography Guidelines

Since the wedding is a worship service, all photographers (both amateur and professional) are asked to hold in reverence the ceremony and the place. Photographic guidelines will be strictly enforced and brides choosing to be married at Peachtree are responsible for informing their photographers (amateur and professional) of these guidelines prior to their wedding. Guests will be asked to turn off their cell phones and refrain from photography during the wedding ceremony.

Pre-Wedding Photography: The church will be open and reserved for the wedding party two hours prior to the start of the wedding ceremony for the purpose of taking pictures. Photographers may use the exterior as well as the interior space of the church for which the bride is contracted. (Chapel weddings are limited to photography in the Chapel, Narthex and Exterior Grounds and may not take photographs in the Sanctuary.) Photographers may use flash and additional lighting up until the doors are opened for guest seating.

Ceremony Photography: Once doors have been opened for guest seating, no flash or additional lighting is permitted. Movement and other distraction should be kept to a minimum. Photographers are limited in the areas from which they can photograph during the ceremony (beginning at the time doors are opened for guest seating) Please see below the specific areas from which photos can be taken in our Sanctuary and Chapel.

Sanctuary Photography: Pictures may be taken from the Narthex, Back of the Sanctuary or Back Balcony. The photographer may take photos from the side aisles, provided they are no closer to the chancel than behind the first column. Photographers may not enter the center aisle for pictures and may not take photos from the Pews other than the back pew. The photographer may take photos from the back pew provided that no guests are seated in that pew and that he does not enter the center aisle to access the pew. Once the ceremony has started, the photographer may center himself in the back of the Sanctuary until the recessional begins, then he must clear that area. Photographers in the back balcony are limited to the area with the double railing and may not move around the balcony. Photographers must use side aisle doors only in the sanctuary and may not enter or exit through center aisle doors.

Chapel Photography: Photographers are limited to the Narthex and back pew of the Chapel (provided there are no guests seated on that row.) Once the ceremony has started, the photographer may center himself in the back of the Chapel until the recessional begins, then he must clear that area. There are no side aisles in the Chapel, so the above guidelines allowing other areas for photography during ceremonies for the Sanctuary do not apply to the Chapel.

Post Wedding Photography: Photography will be allowed after the ceremony, provided that the wedding has not exceeded their allotted time. Photographers may use additional lighting and flash for their post-ceremony photos. We do ask that any photos including the minister be taken first so that they may leave once their photos are completed. Time allotted for photography includes inside and outside the building. When the time has expired, all vendors and wedding party must be clear of the campus inside and out.

Rehearsal Photography: Photographs may be taken during rehearsals, at the Minister's discretion.

If a photographer is photographing a wedding at Peachtree for the first time and would like to schedule a visit prior to the ceremony to see the venue and discuss the guidelines, please contact the Peachtree Wedding Coordinator to arrange a time for them to meet.

Videography Guidelines

If a video recording is to be made of the ceremony, the camera is best located in the back balcony. A remote camera may be used in the front balcony, but not on the chancel. The operator may use the equipment in the side aisles, provided it is no closer to the chancel than behind the first columns on either side. Movement should be kept to a minimum. There will be a staff sound technician on site the day of the wedding to assist with audio setup (they arrive approximately 20 minutes before the ceremony).

Live Streaming

Peachtree has a team of technicians who live stream our Sunday morning worship services. They can be booked to live stream a wedding for an additional cost of \$100. A private YouTube link is created and shared with the couple. It will go live during the ceremony and remain on the web indefinitely for viewing after the ceremony. Please let the Peachtree Wedding Coordinator know at least 2 months in advance if you would like to book live streaming for the wedding.

Wedding Tours

Wedding tours are offered during regular office hours, which are Monday-Friday between 10am and 4pm. Tours are not available on weekends, but prospective couples are invited to visit the Sunday 11am worship service to experience the sanctuary's worship environment with live music.
