The Secretary reported a quorum was present. Mr. Brinkley, Chaplain, offered a prayer.

Matthew Tyler Yates read the Immutable Principles of the Society.

The minutes of the November 4, 2017 meeting were approved on motion of Mr. Hill, seconded by Dr. Baldwin.

President Parker welcomed members to the meeting. He thanked marshal MacNair for his work in preparing the meeting and events.

Vice President Maupin thanked the membership for their large and enthusiastic turnout. He noted annual giving ends on June 30th for this fiscal year. Members are encouraged to make their annual giving contributions before that date. We are working hard to improve participation by all members. He recognized Bill Raiford, Chair of the Annual Giving Committee of the General Society. Mr. Raiford reviewed the many uses of annual giving contributions and thanked members for their generosity.

President Parker next recognized President General Woods for remarks. Mr. Woods received an enthusiastic welcome. He thanked President Parker and Vice President Maupin for their work on behalf of the Society. He also recognized the work of North Carolina member Bill Skinner, Solicitor of the General Society. He mentioned Bill Raiford's work with annual giving, Gil Baldwin's "sense of humor and style in all things – as well as being helpful", J.T. Martin's help with specialty legal issues, Pless Lunger whose efforts should make us all "thrilled and pleased", and Don Munford whose good work with the George and Martha Washington Society is noteworthy. President General Woods described the American Revolution as the most important event in the last thousand years. He outlined challenges faced by our institution in contemporary America. The American Revolution Institute is going to reach out to schools and educators to encourage teaching on Revolutionary War topics and will be partnering with other like-minded groups in this effort.

Assistant Secretary Hardin Sigmon reported on activities of the Membership Outreach Committee. The Committee, consisting of 28 leaders, will be periodically contacting our membership to encourage members to come to meetings, to respond to any questions about the Society, and to encourage donations to further the Society's mission. This has been a great success. MemberHub software is a great source of information. This will help us keep our member information up to date and to provide current information on activities of the Society. Next, he announced the Historic Permanent Roster was at the meeting. Individuals are technically not members of the Society until they have signed the Permanent Roster. This was made available after the meeting for all members to ensure their signatures are recorded. He thanked Bill Sigmon for organizing the first annual golf tournament, a great event. The winners were J.T. Martin, Anita Martin, Rich Raiford, Bob Bratton and the closest to the pin was Bob Bratton and Tarlton Long.

Secretary Lennon announced any members needing a letter to authorize the purchase of an Eagle, Society merchandise, or a diploma should send him an email. On request, a letter of authorization will be promptly sent. The website for the North Carolina Society is www.ncsocietycincinnati.org. Members are encouraged to check their membership data online to confirm it is correct. We are also trying to update contact information for all designated successors. That information should be forwarded to headquarters.

Historian Joe Kluttz was recognized to give the report of the By-Laws Committee. He began by noting that the other committee members, Chuck Neely and Stuart Dorsett "are nowhere to be found." He then presented the three proposed changes in order. Copy attached.

First, Article XI, Section 8 was reviewed. This is intended to provide a tool to deal with inactive members.

The Second amendment, Article XII, new Section 6, was described in detail.

The last amendment, restating Article XIII regarding honorary members was summarized.

All questions were answered. A vote of 2/3 of those present was required. Upon the call of the question all amendments passed by a vote of 2/3 of those present or more. Past President Cheshire commended the committee for reasonable and well-considered proposals. His remarks were applauded.

Marshal MacNair, expressed thanks to the membership for their strong participation this weekend. He described planned luncheon, afternoon tours and evening events. Secretary Lennon announced that Marshal MacNair had been commended for an outstanding job this morning by a unanimous vote of the Standing Committee.

Past President Hill presented the Treasurer's report and confirmed the contributions which have been made have been generous. He explained the function of the Permanent Fund, the Operating Fund and the Triennial Fund. He reviewed financial reports which had been copied and distributed. He commended the work of Treasurer Chuck Neely. The N.C. Society is financially sound, and the loyalty of the membership to the Society is remarkable.

President Parker recognized Registrar Morrison for his report. Mr. Morrison noted the ballots have been circulated identifying eleven individuals who have applied for hereditary and elected successor membership in the Society. Prospective members were excused from the room. (See attached list) On Motion of the Standing Committee, the nominations were closed, and the prospective members were unanimously accepted by acclamation. Following the vote, the new members were received with a standing ovation, led to the front, and presented with Insignia of the Society by President General Woods and President Parker with Vice President Maupin, Registrar Morrison, Secretary Lennon and family members assisting.

President Parker next recognized Past President Hill, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, who presented the report on nominations. Mr. Hill noted that some members of the Standing Committee are appointed and are thus not elected. The nomination slate is attached. The report has been previously approved by the Standing Committee. The report on nominations, coming from Committee, was unanimously approved.

President-elect Maupin thanked the membership for their support. He encouraged participation and pledged to rely on the new team. He commended President Parker, stating what an exceptional job he had done. President-elect Maupin and Secretary Lennon presented a resolution honoring President Parker for his outstanding dedication and service. This was unanimously approved by the membership. A copy is attached.

Marshal-elect Lennon announced plans for future meetings.

There being no further business, Mr. Lennon presented the Necrology. (See attachment) Since the last meeting, the North Carolina Society has learned of the death of the following members:

Proposed amendments to bylaws of NC Society of the Cincinnati

Amendment to Article XI to add new Section 8

Section 8.

Upon recommendation of the Membership Committee, reasonable prior notice to the member in question, and affirmative vote of the Standing Committee, any hereditary member or elected successor member who has been inactive for a period of three years or more may be declared to be an Inactive Member or Inactive Elected Successor Member. Inactivity is demonstrated by a failure to provide meaningful financial support to the Society during the prior three-year period. For good cause, the Membership Committee or Standing Committee may decide not to assign an hereditary member or elected successor member to inactive status.

Inactive Members and Inactive Elected Successor Members shall be listed in the Permanent Roster as Inactive Members or Inactive Elected Successor Members, shall be removed from the mailing list for Society publications and invitations, will not be able to name a successor or sponsor or endorse applications for membership in the Society, and will not have any other privileges of membership. An Inactive Elected Successor member shall have no right to succeed to membership under the right of his hereditary member's propositus. An Active Elected Successor Member may apply under the provisions of Article XII to become an hereditary member.

At any time, upon application of the Inactive Member or Inactive Elected Successor Member, recommendation of the Membership Committee and vote of the Standing Committee, an Inactive Member or Inactive Elected Successor Member may be restored to full membership in the Society.

Upon recommendation of the Membership Committee and Standing Committee, reasonable prior notice to the Inactive Member in question, and affirmative vote of the Society, an applicant for membership otherwise meeting the qualifications for hereditary membership, including compliance with the provisions of Article XI, Section 2, may be elected an hereditary member under the right of the Inactive Member's propositus.- Upon such election the Inactive Member shall no longer be a member of the Society.

Amendment to Article XII to add new Section 6.

Section 6.

Notwithstanding Article XI, Section 1, Subject to the approval of the Standing Committee, an hereditary member who is sixty-five (65) years of age or more and has been a member of the Society in good standing for not less than ten (10) years may propose in writing that his elected successor member, provided that the elected successor member is in good standing, be deemed an hereditary member with all of the rights of an hereditary member. Such action by the hereditary member and approval by the Standing Committee shall in no way limit or abridge his rights as a member of the Society. Upon completion of five years as an hereditary member in

good standing, the new hereditary member may designate a successor, subject to the provisions of these Bylaws and the Institution. Only the new hereditary member may designate a successor under the provisions of this section.

Amendment to restate Article XIII

The admission of honorary members, for life only, shall be confined to those who shall be eminent lineal descendants or representatives of those who were distinguished by high military or civil virtues and services in the Revolutionary War or those who shall have rendered to the country or to the State of North Carolina distinguished service and whose views are directed to the same laudable objects as those of the Society. They shall have been approved for honorary membership in the Society by the secret unanimous vote of those present at a meeting of the Standing Committee. An honorary member shall have no vote and shall hold no office, elective or otherwise. No member of the Society shall approach a nonmember on the subject of honorary membership unless and until the nonmember has been duly elected an honorary member.

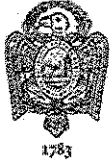

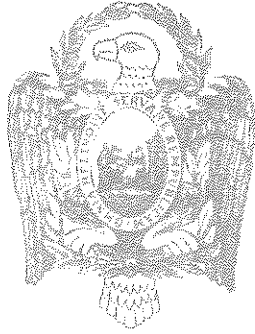
