Using My Five Senses to Write My Name

(**Note to Learning Coach:** Your student will need a box of **gelatin powder** (any flavor!), and **white liquid glue** for this activity. Also, to help guide your student with this activity, you will find a completed example of this worksheet on the last page of this document.)



Directions: Follow the steps below and have fun writing your name with gelatin powder! You will be using all five of your senses for this project, so pay close attention.

Step 1: Shake your box of gelatin powder. What does it sound like when you shake it?

Step 2: In the box below, write your name with a pencil. Do not forget to use your very best handwriting.

Step 3: Using a bottle of white glue, trace over your name above with the glue.

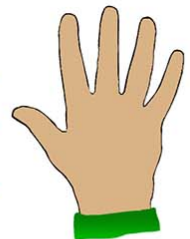
Step 4: Open the package of your gelatin powder. Take a little taste of your gelatin powder.

Step 7: Now that your name is in gelatin, use the rest of your five senses to describe your name.

My name smells like



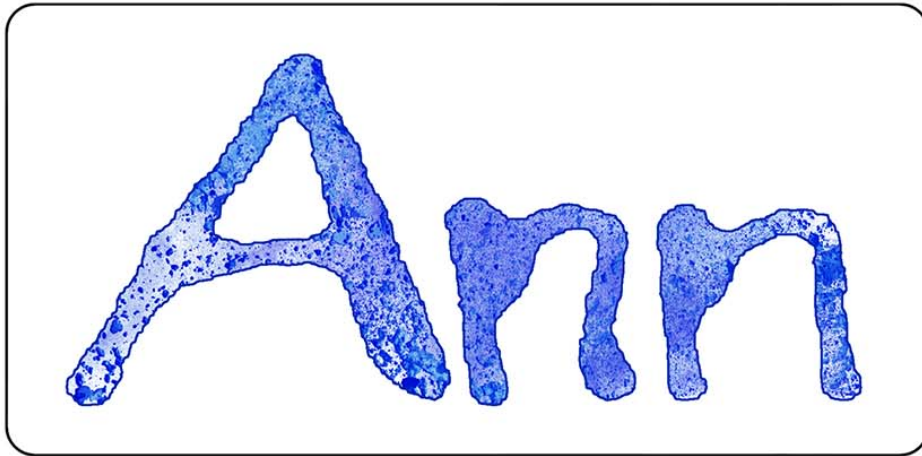
