Grade Level: PreK-2

Complete this reflection page after watching the Deeper Look video: Jeff Sprague. In this piece, Dr. Sprague describes how bystanders, the people who are present but not involved in the bullying, can help stop bullying from happening. Write a sentence or draw a picture that responds to each question.

1. Near the beginning of the video, Dr. Sprague talks about bystanders, the people who are present when bullying is happening but not involved. There is a picture of one boy bullying another, with a boy watching the bullying. Why do you think the boy doesn't stop the bullying?

2. Dr. Sprague tells us that if one bystander steps in and tells the person who is bullying, "You need to stop. This is unacceptable," then it is easier for the person being bullied to say, "You need to stop. This is unacceptable," as well. Why is it important to have someone step in and help when bullying is happening?

3. Dr. Sprague also says that when a bystander steps in to help stop the bullying, it makes it easier for the victim to tell the teacher. It does not feel like tattling when someone else sees the bullying and steps in to help. Do you think this is true or false? Why?
