Grade Level: High School

Pre-viewing: Before watching the video...

1. How do you define justice?
2. How are justice and fairness similar? Different?
3. Mohandas Gandhi said, "There is a higher court than the courts of justice and that is the court of conscience. It supersedes all other courts." What does that quote mean to you?
4. How do you think your self of fairness will continue to develop into adulthood?

Discussion Questions: After you watch the video...

1. Why is this video call *Justice*?
2. The narrator tells us that nobody believed Jayme could ever have done such a thing. How did her story of drinking and partying progress when she was in college?
3. Why is it important that the video lets us hear about Mr. King's life when talking about justice and fairness?
4. How do we determine what is just or fair? Is three years in jail a fair trade for someone's life? Explain.
5. Jayme says, "I can't be mad because I let it happen to myself" when she talks about her incarceration. Do you think this is the right way for her to deal with her sentence? Why or why not?
6. Which person in the story experienced the greatest injustice? Explain your answer.
7. Is justice always fair? Is fairness always just? Explain.
8. Can people disagree on the fairness of something? Provide an example that illustrates your argument. Can people disagree on the justice of something? When people disagree, how should it be handled?
