PASSENGER AND FREIGHT CRASH

Accident on Grand Trunk Near Dundas, Last Night

T., H. & B. Cars Jumped Track and Tied Up Traffic

A west bound freight train and an east bound immigrant train collided on the Grand Trunk railway last night just east of Dundas station. Three freight cars were derailed, passengers on the immigrant train shaken up, and traffic blocked for three hours, while the wrecking crew from Hamilton cleared the tracks.

The freight train was pulling into the siding at the quarry when the east bound immigrant train struck it. Fortunately the latter train was not running at high speed, otherwise the results would have been serious. The three derailed freight cars were in such a position as to block both east and west bound traffic. The engine of the immigrant train was slightly damaged, but was able to proceed under its own steam, no one being injured on either train. The derailed cars were loaded with merchandise. The accident happened about 9 o'clock p.m., and Dr. Bertram, of Dundas, was immediately called in anticipation of some one being injured. His services, however, were not required. It kept an auxiliary crew from Hamilton busy several hours clearing the line.
