# ENGINEER CAMPBELL

## KILLED IN G.T.R. WRECK

ENGINE LEFT TRACK OWING TO  
WASHOUT NEAR RAVENS-  
WORTH.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, March 27.—Engineer W. G. Campbell of Depot Harbor was killed, and Fireman E. Kemp of Depot Harbor, was injured when the engine of a westbound G. T. R. passenger train which left Ottawa at 5 a.m. to-day left the track owing to a washout two miles west of Ravensworth, Ont., in the district of Parry Sound. The accident happened at 2.45 o'clock this afternoon. None of the passengers was injured, the only part of the train to leave the tracks being the engine. Conductor J. H. Roberts of Ottawa was in charge of the train.
