HEAD-ON COLLISION KILLS TWO SOLDIERS AND INJURES OTHERS

Troop Train and Freight Crash, and Men and Horses Die

TWO ARE IN HOSPITAL

One Victim Pinned by Falling Car, and Is Extricated Alive

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)
Ottawa, July 23.—Leaving two of their comrades dead in Arrprior, and two seriously injured in the Victoria Hospital, Renfrew, as the result of a head-on collision between the troop train and a freight train on the Canadian Pacific Railway, about a quarter of a mile west of Sand Point Station, members of a squadron of the Royal Canadian Dragoons, B Company of the Royal Canadian Regiment, both of St. John's, Que., late this afternoon completed their trip to Petawawa Camp. With them on the train were members of the Royal Twenty-second Regiment of Quebec City, which had joined the St. John's Corps at Montreal on Tuesday night, but none of the members of the Twenty-second was injured. The accident happened at 1 o'clock this morning, and the men who were killed or injured were in two cars, looking after the horses, which were placed next to the engine and in front of the other cars carrying equipment and the coaches for the men.

The dead are: Trooper Thomas Gordon of St. John's, Que., and Lance Corporal Vincent J. Cullinan of San Francisco, Cal.

Those in the hospital at Renfrew are Troopers James Doherty and Joseph
