## COLLISION NEAR NOVAR.

**FAST EXPRESS DASHES INTO  
STANDING FREIGHT.**

**Brakeman N. Richardson Killed and  
Two Other Trainmen Badly Injured  
—Accident Said to be Due to Stall-  
ing of Freight Train.**

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Barrie, April 8.—Brakeman Nelson Richardson of Midland lost his life in a rear-end collision which occurred at 3.30 this morning near Novar between the Soo express, No. 31, and a freight train. Two other members of the freight crew, Conductor Wellington and Brakeman Miles, of Barrie, also were injured, the former possibly fatally. The caboose and two freight cars were smashed, but the express sustained little damage, and no passengers were injured. The freight is said to have been stalled, owing to lack of steam, and before a flag could be sent out the passenger train rounded a curve and crashed into the standing train.
