FORT ERIE RAILWAY WILL BE ABANDONED

Shortest Line in Canada, It Must Go With Erie Beach Resort

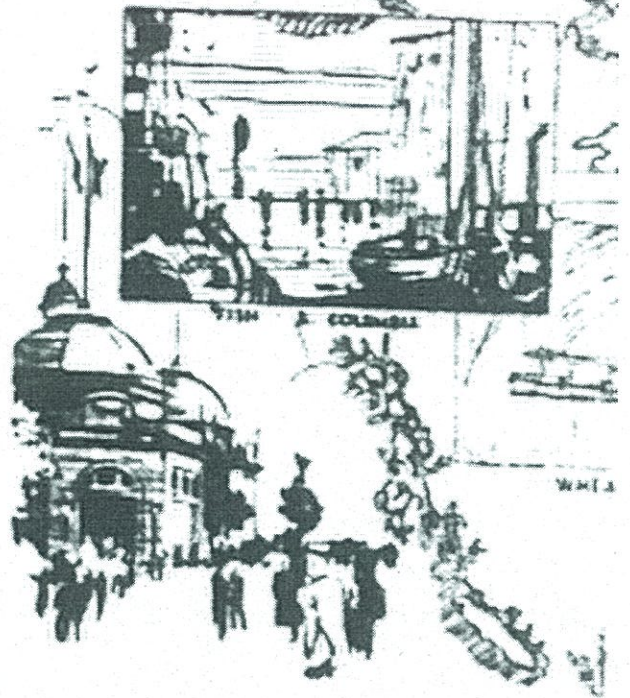

Fort Erie, Aug. 28 — Erie Beach, amusement resort founded 50 years ago, and mecca of thousands of picnickers from both sides of the border, passes as a resort on Monday night and will be subdivided into building lots.

With the passing of the beach, what is believed to be the shortest railway in Canada is about to be junked. It is the Port Erie, Snakehill and Pacific, which has bumped its way along over a two-mile course between Fort Erie and Erie Beach for the last 20 years.

Upward of a million dollars worth of amusement devices which went to make up Erie Beach will be torn down and sold to make way for the new real estate development. Included are two passenger boats which have operated between the beach and downtown Buffalo. Fort Erie ferries, however, will continue to operate, company officials said.
