

Dee Miller (“The Duchess of the Blues”) is a St Paul girl, who spent her early days as a child listening to her mother singing the blues around the house in Maplewood, Minnesota.

Her teenage years found her singing as she walked down the railroad tracks near her home. Her early influences (Bonnie Raitt, Etta James, and Koko Taylor) led to a career in which Dee has worked with many fine musicians and on many stages.

Guitarist Jimi "Primetime" Smith was an integral part of the Dee Miller Band for several years - years that Dee counts as some of her best. One of the best outcomes of that work was the award winning “Lady in the Leopard Print Dress” which she and Jimi cowrote. The current band personnel featuring singer/guitarist Craig Clark will represent the Minnesota at the International Blues Competition in Memphis Tennessee.
