

Veteran sax man Jerry Weldon, has been on the jazz scene for more than 35 years. Jerry, a native New Yorker, joined Lionel Hampton's Orchestra in 1981 upon graduating from Rutgers Jazz Program. In 1990, Jerry became a charter member and featured soloist in Harry Connick Jr.'s newly formed big band and now can be seen daily on Connick's new daytime television program, HARRY. During his tenure with Connick, Jerry has toured extensively in the U.S. and Canada, as well as Europe, Asia, Australia and appeared on dozens of television programs. Weldon has worked with many jazz greats including: Jack McDuff, Jimmy McGriff, Joey DeFrancesco, Al Grey, George Cables, Jimmy Cobb, Keter Betts, Roy Haynes, George Benson, Earl Klugh and Mel Tormé. With more sideman sides than he can count and eight CD's as a leader, Jerry's latest, "*On the Move,*" spent two months on the "Jazz Week" charts. Jer is at work on a new recording.
