With the cooperation of Mother Nature, we will run this show outdoors. If weather dictates otherwise, we will post an indoor schedule in the barns and on Facebook.

It is our intention to comply with all regulations regarding social distancing and facial coverings that are in effect at the time of the show. The six foot guidelines will be important to observe. Everyone over two years of age not mounted must wear a mask. We request that Exhibitors and Trainers do not congregate in close quarters around the in-gate areas.

If you are not feeling well, we will appreciate it if you stay home.

Trainers are responsible to taking temperatures of all people in their group each day.

New horse wash areas are located on the Thruway side of the indoor arena. Please use the barn entrance closest to your stalls. Please do not congregate in the barn aisles.

Those adjusting jumps in the schooling areas are asked to wear gloves. Please spray the jump cups with the provided disinfectant after using them.

A single representative of the barn can then bring the paper copies to the entry tent. We are trying to keep direct contact to a minimum.
