Coming back to church

- Check your health. If you have symptoms do not attend. You should not feel pressure to come back to church immediately. Indeed not coming back if you might have symptoms is one way to love your neighbour.
- Bring a Bible! Church hymn books and Bibles will not be available.
- Masks are preferable. Wearing a mask may protect the people around you, especially if you are infected asymptotomatically; by doing so you would be putting the interests of others first.
- Enter and exit quickly. Aim to be in the church as close to 12 noon as possible, and leave promptly after the service. There will be opportunities to mingle safely outside on the lawn afterwards.
- Sanitize! Use the hand sanitizer provided on entry and exit.
- Follow the signs. Walk in the front entrance and turn left. Follow the arrows on the floor all the way round until you come to a free seat. Please fill up the pews from the back right hand side. Exit by the door on the right hand side, first in first out.
- Singing. Did you know the minister and anyone speaking is expected to keep four metres distance from the congregation? On the same principle, for the moment, we are trying to in our services to have hymns and songs which are "softer" pieces. These may be listened to prayerfully or sung quietly.
- Keep giving. There will be no offering collected. Please leave your offering in the plate at the back of church as you arrive or leave. If you give electronically you might consider continuing to do this.
- Plan ahead. There will be limited access to toilets.
- Families sit together. Children are the responsibility of their parents/guardians. It is important that no one breaks the social distancing rules.

These procedures will change as new government and Assembly Buildings advice is issued.
