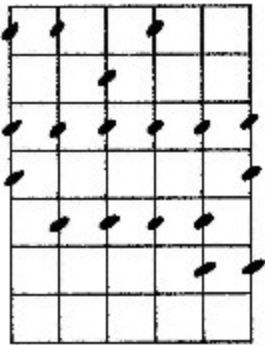


Melodic Minor

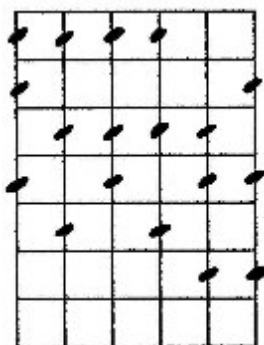
3 note per string

The Melodic Minor scale is one of the four 'main' scales in use, along with Major, Harmonic Minor, and Harmonic Major. It's a seven note scale consisting of 1/2 and whole steps. It's spelling is 1 2 b3 4 5 6 7, and is often referred to as 'Jazz Minor'. The Melodic Minor scale has quite a few useful modes, which I'll outline in another sheet. This particular set is 3 note per string, which makes it easier to pick, but does include shifts. Below are fingerings derived from each degree of the scale, giving coverage across the fingerboard.

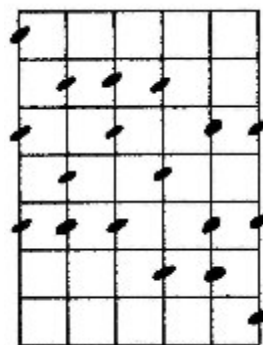
