## GRIZZLY BASE

### BIGFORK, MONTANA – WEBELOS RESIDENT CAMP

Activities are primarily aquatics based, however, land based activities are also available.



## MOHAB (MONTANA OUTDOOR HIGH ADVENTURE BASE)

### THEODORE ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL RANCH

Wilderness trekking and pack rafting training program for Scouts and Venturers in America's remotest wilderness! The *Montana High Adventure Base* (MOHAB) is a nationally accredited Boy Scouts of America High Adventure Base with 10 times as much room to roam as Philmont. MOHAB is open for Boy Scout troops and venturing crews as well as their adult leaders. MOHAB offers participants basecamp training and hands on experiences that will provide them with the opportunity to safely lead themselves on their own wilderness expedition.



**CAMP DIRECTOR** - 21 years or older. Attend National Camp School (provided by Council)

Maintains a constant concern for the health, safety, welfare, and enjoyment of the campers who visit the camp. Manages the operation of the camp and ensures that the camp stays within its operating budget. Monitors the camp program and service to see that every participant enjoys a quality experience. Reports to the Council Program Director.

**PROGRAM DIRECTOR** - 21 years or older. Attend National Camp School (provided by Council)

Responsible for the coordination and operation of all the program departments in seeing that the basic policies of the program of the Boy Scouts of America are carried out in the program of the camp. The Program Director's primary responsibility is to all instruction in the Programs areas and all activities associated with those areas. Most activities that take place on a daily basis are the direct responsibility of the Program Director. Reports to the Camp Director.

**COOK** - 21 years or older. Food Handlers Certification from the State of Montana

Make a list of needed food for purchase each week. Oversee the cooking of food and that it is served on time. Maintaining sanitation of the kitchen. Maintain compliance with any BSA, State or Local regulations. Reports to the Camp Director.

**HANDYMAN / RANGER** -

Oversees the General Maintenance and Safety of Camp. Makes repairs to equipment and facilities. Maintains the cleanliness, safety and appearance of the camp. Reports to the Camp Director.

**ASSISTANT COOK** - 18 years or older. Food Handlers Certification from the State of Montana.

Responsible for the cooking of food and seeing that it is served on time. Helps in maintaining the sanitation of the kitchen. Reports to the head cook.

**AQUATICS DIRECTOR** - 21 years or older. Attend National Camp School (provided by Council), Current Life Guard Cert from BSA or Red Cross, Current Cert in First Aid / CPR.

Development and carrying out of the waterfront program for the campers and Staff members. Oversee the BSA swim test classification of all Scouts and leaders. Keeping of accurate records of the advancement made by Scouts participating in the Aquatics program. Maintain discipline over campers, staff and operate a safe program area.

**AREA DIRECTOR** - 18 years or older. Opportunities to Attend National Camp School (provided by Council)

Maintains the cleanliness, safety and appearance of the program area. Oversees the teaching of merit badge and skills courses. Keeps accurate records of camper's advancement. Reports to the camp Program Director.

**CAMP HEALTH OFFICER** - 18 years or older. EMT Certification or higher, Complete BSA Health Officer Training

Maintain the cleanliness and appearance of the Health Lodge and the area around it. Administer basic first aid for injured campers and staff and keep accurate records in the daily Medical Logs. Gather and secure camper and staff Health and Medical records. Conduct camper health check in process each week.

**TREK LEADER** - 18 years or older. Current Cert in Wilderness First Aid / CPR. Leads training in back country skill and how to use pack rafts. Will support crews while in the back country.

**COUNSELOR** - 16 Years older

Helps to maintain the cleanliness, safety and appearance of the program area. Trains specific skills for various Merit Badge and Skills courses. Reports to the Area Director.
