in case of **HEATSTROKE:**

WHAT TO DO:

DO move your pet to a shaded/cool environment. If possible, determine their temperature and record it.



DO cool the body by wetting your pet down and placing a fan on them or exposing them to a breeze.



DO take your pet to the nearest veterinary facility immediately.

WHAT NOT TO DO:

DON'T use very cold water or ice for cooling.



DON'T over-cool your pet's body.

DON'T force water down your pet's mouth, but do have fresh water available for them.



DON'T leave your pet unattended.

A note about DOGS WITH SHORT FACES: Brachycephalic dogs, like pugs and boxers, are the most likely candidates for heatstroke due to the structure of their airways and the inability of passing air quickly over the tongue through panting to keep their bodies cool.

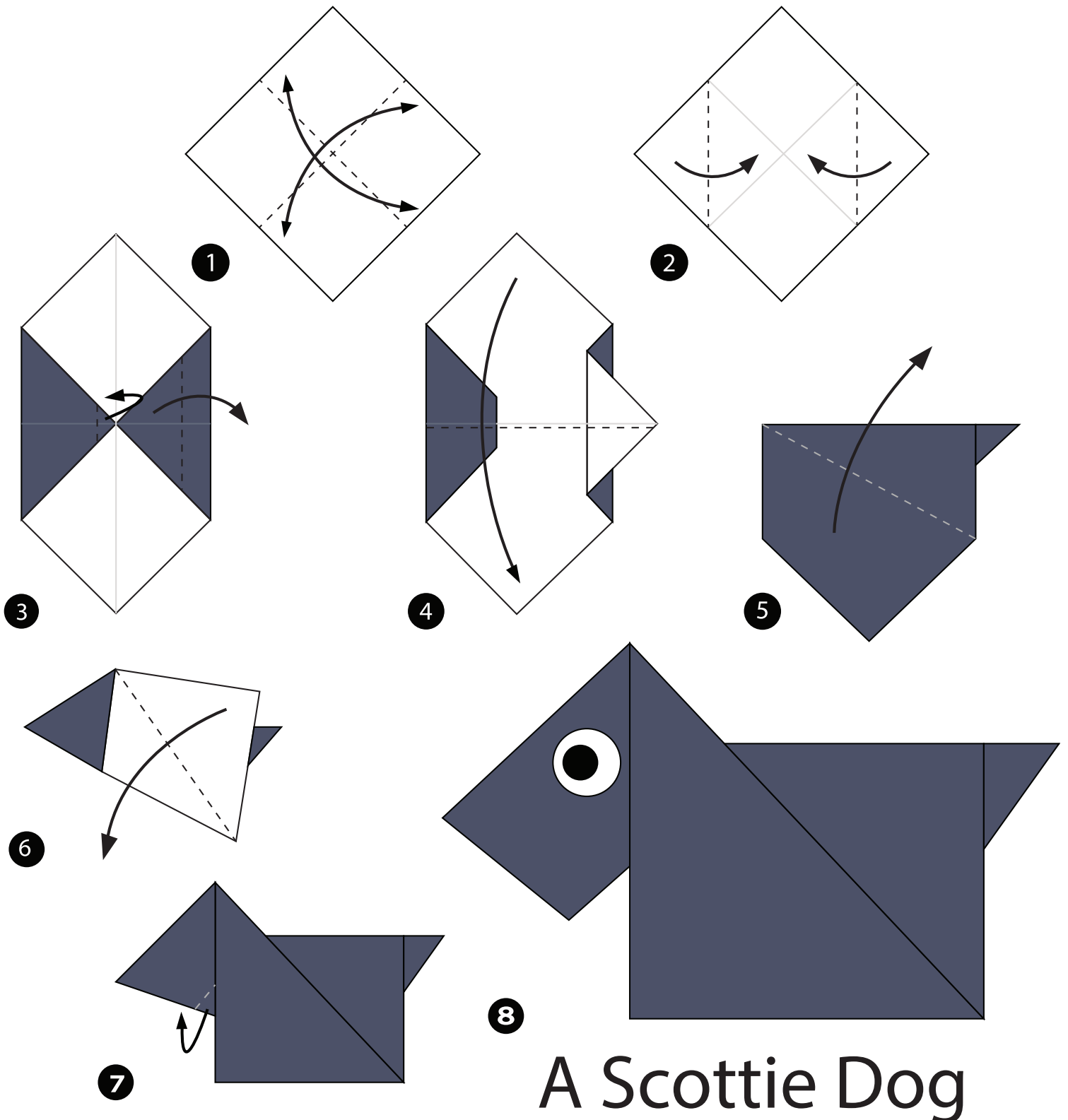
how long does it take for a car to get **hot!**

90°	109°	124°
95°	114°	129°

Even in the shade, the temperature in the car can still soar quickly to dangerous levels.

Leaving the windows open has little effect on how hot it is inside the car.
