He has his choice of luxurious places to sleep.

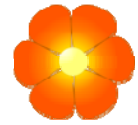
He receives these accommodations absolutely free.

Did You Know?

AKC MEET THE BREEDS®: Tibetan Spaniel

One of the three native Tibetan breeds in the Non-Sporting group (along with the Lhasa Apso and the Tibetan Terrier), the Tibetan Spaniel is small, active and alert. They are low to the ground, with a body slightly longer than tall. Popular primarily as companion dogs in their native Tibet, "Tibbies" are also now found in the conformation, obedience and agility rings in the United States. The breed can be all colors including cream, gold and sable, with white markings allowed on the feet.

A Look Back

Found in early Eastern art dating back as far as 1100 BC, Tibetan Spaniels were prized as pets and companions in Tibetan monasteries. Referred to as "little Lions" by their masters, they would sit on monastery walls and keep watch over the countryside below, barking to alert the monastery inhabitants of any impending trouble. The breed's development was influenced by dogs from China and other Buddhist countries, as Tibbies were sent between the countries as gifts.

Right Breed for You?

A very intelligent breed, the Tibetan Spaniel thrives on human companionship and needs to be with its people. Although outgoing and friendly, the breed may be aloof with strangers. Tibbies need only moderate exercise, so they are excellent in apartments. Their double coats need weekly brushing.

Research request on purebred growth control

From Marion Bradshaw

Dear Dog Owner,

I am a geneticist at Cornell's College of Veterinary Medicine working to understand growth control in purebred dogs. My laboratory hunts for genes that make dogs big or little. Because dog breeds vary enormously in size, they are a powerful resource for finding these genes.

I'm writing to ask for your help in this work. Would you be willing to donate blood samples from your purebred dogs, or do you know other owners who may help? Contributing samples is easy. Please see the details below and contact us if you're interested.

Just spoke with Eddie Dziuk at OFA. He runs the CHIC DNA bank in cooperation with AKC Canine Health Foundation and he has worked with this researcher at Missouri and now at Cornell. CHIC samples may also be used in this study. So it sounds very legit.

I would encourage everyone to work to submit DNA samples through the CHIC DNA Bank. CHIC is set up to provide canine DNA to all researchers with approved projects. If a breed has a well populated CHIC DNA program, that breed will way more likely to be chosen for research since the time and money expended to obtain certain samples can be eliminated and we, as owners, are not subject to "sample fatigue" every time we turn around. See information at www.caninehealthinfo.org Blood draws can be conducted at specialties at reduced costs to participants.

When specific DNA samples to go an individual the samples may not be available to other researchers or projects and end up being orphaned with the end of that project. With CHIC, multiple generational samples can always be available to all researchers.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT •

-- *New Performance and Agility Opportunities Available to Competitors* --

New York, NY - The American Kennel Club has recently launched several new competitive opportunities for exhibitors in Performance Events and Agility, and I'm pleased to update you about the success and progress of these programs. The Blue Grass Coursing Club and Greyhound Association of North em Georgia hosted the first AKC Coursing Ability Tests at the end of February. This new Titling event, which tests the dog's ability to course, opens up the fun of Lure Coursing to beyond sight hounds to all dogs - purebreds and mixed-breeds.

There were 28 different breeds of all shapes and sizes coursed, including a Newfoundland, Great Dane, Boxers, Cardigan Welsh Corgis as well as mixed-breed dogs. The first dog to eam a Coursing Ability Title was "Juno," a Belgian Tervuren who also eamed his AKC Championship three weeks prior.

The clubs received 158 entries over the five tests, and approximately 75% of the dogs passed, but the real focus was on camaraderie and fun. Competitors provided positive feedback, cheered on each other's dogs and enjoyed the day. We look forward to seeing this event expand to clubs across the country. A big thank you goes to Doug Ljungren, AKC's Performance Events AVP, for bringing this new sport to life!

In Agility, I'm pleased to announce the creation of the Preferred Agility Championship title, or PACH, which will take effect July 1st. Originally scheduled for 2013, we're happy to implement it almost 2 years ahead of schedule to recognize our Preferred Agility dogs. Dogs must achieve a minimum of 750 championship points and 20 double qualifying scores from the Excellent Standard and Jumpers with Weaves classes to obtain the championship.

The PACH title is also retroactive, so that any dog that met the requirements prior to July 1st, 2011 will have PACH prefix added to their AKC registered name in the registration database.

There is a heartbreaking story in the Record Courier today (05/27/2011) about a 3-4 year-old female spayed Doberman at the Douglas County Animal Shelter (775-782-9061). She is blind. Due to circumstances beyond my control at this time, I cannot rescue her. Can you send a broadcast email to the members to see if anyone has room for this poor girl? She looks to be purebred.

Great Western Terrier Association will be holding 2 AKC ED tests on Mon, June 27th, 1 AKC ED test on Tues, June 28th, and 1 AWTA trial on June 28th – in the afternoon. Premiums and further details can be found at http://duffyscavern.org/Earthe_dogges.htm. These tests are following the conformation shows on Fri, Sat, and Sun at the Queen Mary in Long Beach. The AKC tests are open to all AKC short-legged terriers and dachshunds (all varieties). The AWTA trial is open to all short-legged terriers, dachshunds, and mixes thereof. They do not need to be registered with any kennel club.

The tests and trial will be at Canyon RV Park, Anaheim Hills, CA. Lunches are pot luck each day. There's quite a bit of shade – but I recommend bringing more, just in case. There are motels nearby, cabins for rent, and RV spots available. Mon nite, we will either have a catered BBQ at the site or go to a really neat BBQ place not very far away (price to be determined).

SUBJECT: AKC Publications

We are very pleased to announce some upcoming changes to our AKC magazines.

Starting with the July/August 2011 issue, AKC Family Dog will launch an exciting new digital version as a companion to the print edition. Digital Family Dog will have the same content as the print edition, but it will also be enhanced with interactive features including slide shows, videos, and live links to web sites. Each issue will also display a link to the online breeder classifieds.

As part of AKC's ongoing outreach to the general dog-owning public, every issue of the digital Family Dog will be emailed on a complimentary basis to over 600,000 dog owners. For even more exposure, digital Family Dog will also be available through the AKC website and Facebook page. With this hybrid print and digital strategy we expect Family Dog to achieve between about 5,000,000 and 6,000,000 consumer impressions per year for the AKC, and become the most widely read dog magazine in the world!

AKC Gazette & Events will be reformatted, transitioning from a print magazine to a PDF document posted monthly to the AKC web site. Effective with the October, 2011 issue, this new incarnation of the venerable AKC Gazette will include the Chairman's and President's letters, AKC Updates, the Parent Club breed columns (these columns will be enhanced with links to the Parent Clubs' web sites), and the Secretary's Pages. This electronic version of the AKC Gazette will be available for free with access to all, and posted on the Delegates Portal. All club members, fanciers and dog lovers will have regular free access to the very popular breed columns. Subscribers who currently pay for the print edition will have the subscription converted to Family Dog or the option of a pro-rata refund. We believe that this change will be a highly cost effective way to perpetuate the most vital Gazette content and make it available to a significantly wider audience. Other content in the current print magazine, e.g. AKC Delegate and Board meeting minutes and the Chairman's report, will continue to be posted and archived on the AKC web site.

The Show Awards CD will be replaced by equivalent online reports that will be available through the web site. This transition will be effective in January 2012.

All of these changes are designed to best leverage our content, serve a broader constituency and bring AKC publications into the digital age.
