Well, we did have Sunrise Service, but it was sure different. Nancy has been through death and life with me for the last 36 years and neither of us has ever missed an Easter Sunrise service. She was at the first MCC General Conference I sang for, she was at my mother's funeral, she married my daughter and son-in-law and did the dedication for my youngest granddaughter – I could go on and on. SO, we determined we would do a Sunrise Service together this year. Then the question was HOW? Everyone thought Zoom was perfect....until they listened to live music on Zoom. The sound has some sort of compression on it to help with muting background noises and even if I fixed the sound on my computer, no one listening to it would be able to hear it very well.

But there's Facebook live recorded on an iPhone. That's better music, but you can't get two people in from two different places. As you might expect, this is where Cindy enters the picture. How to combine Facebook Live and Zoom? There is probably a lovely and technical way to do that, but what Cindy did was get up at 5am our time (since we were doing the Sunrise Service on Florida time) and get everything set up. She got the iPhone recording and lights and my guitar and music ready to go on Facebook Live. Then she got Rev. Nancy on another iPhone on a Zoom call. (See if you can picture this.) She took the iPhone with Nancy on it and attached it to a broom handle at the same height as the iPhone that was on Facebook live. So, when Nancy opened the service, Cindy was holding the phone with Nancy on a Zoom meeting up to the Facebook Live phone, with the broom handle so she could move Nancy

into the frame of the Facebook Live feed and then move her off for me to sing and then move her back to pray and preach. No one else could see how Cindy was maneuvering the phone with Nancy on it, but having it on a broom stick made it a little steadier than just hold it up.

It was wonderful and hilarious at the same time and the one thing that Cindy was devastated about was that you have to keep the phone upright or "portrait," not "landscape" when you are on Facebook Live. Otherwise for people on computers, the whole picture is sideways! Well, sunrise came and went and it was too late to change it, but fortunately people were very gracious about our goof. And Nancy didn't mind being moved about on a broomstick 😊.

Having had that experience, we felt a little better about it when someone asked us to do an online concert for a special group. Healing Housing is a place that is a ministry partner of our church, Brentwood United Methodist Church (BUMC). People at BUMC saw that there were a lot of young women who came through rehab programs of 30 days or 90 days, but then had no way to get back into regular life (remember that?) again. So we opened a home where women coming out of recovery programs could stay for up to 6 months. It provides food and shelter, but even more importantly, jobs. Local businesses partnered with Healing Housing and each woman was required to work to begin supporting herself in Healing Housing and saving for the time when she would be ready to leave the house and start out on her own. This was all going pretty well for a while before the pandemic hit. Women lost their jobs, some were quarantined elsewhere, most were staying in place but it was devastating overall to the ministry there. Last year, some of you might remember, I sang at a fundraiser for them. This year, they just asked if I could do a concert directed to the women at Healing Housing rather than directed to donors.

SO on May 5th, that's what Cindy and I will do on Facebook Live on my FB page (Marsha Stevens-Pino – there's only one of me on Facebook). You are all welcome to drop in, but our singing and sharing will be set up to be for the women of Healing Housing. (Also, there will be no need of broomsticks for this event!)

If you drop in, please think about whether setting up an online concert and sharing time like this would be helpful to any group that you're part of. We'd love to do some more.

I can't wait till we can all hug again!!!! (I actually have dreams about hugging people.) I guess cyberhugs for now. Miss you all.

The girl we sponsor, Gloria, is heading into high school in Uganda. Cindy has spent several lovely visits at their home, and was able to get her a purple bunkbed. She was thrilled.
