June was an interesting month for us. Some of you had asked about the concert & music work we were doing at Sandy Cove campground in Maryland. A woman had contacted me to do music for the retreat & a concert one night. Shelley shared with me that she had been a camper/counselor at this camp when she was younger. She & her wife attend an American Baptist church in Pennsylvania & she asked if I could do the morning service at this church. I asked if Cindy could come – both because it would be a lovely getaway for us, & because it is so nice for Cindy to be there. She learned to play guitar with the camp singalongs, she does some songs with me, & she gives wonderful messages. Shelley thought that would be a great idea, so we started planning.

One of you contacted us & wanted to come, but they explained this was a group that has met every year & they reserve rooms just for that group. It turned out that Shelley paid for a special suite for Cindy & me since I was a surprise for the group. It seems that For Those Tears I Died (Come to the Water) was their favorite camp song all those years ago. When they were singing it last year, Shelley thought *hey, I'll bet the woman who wrote that would come do a concert for us next year.*

Another friend phoned me to say that her church, which is openly LGBTQ affirming, was told they could not use that campground since the campground owners believe in "Biblical marriage." Of course, so do I! But what they mean by that is one woman & one man. I immediately contacted Shelley to be sure she knew about that & offered to let her cancel if our orientation, or marriage, was a problem. She felt the group had known her & her wife for years & they were fine with us. She did ask me to list the concert at the campground as a private event on my website, which I did.

It did end up being a kind of challenge. Of course, the whole reason you support us is because you feel this ministry is needed, so none of us should be surprised. We were *definitely* a problem for many of the people there. Several in the group confronted Shelley while we were there when they found that my VERY good friend Mary Pearson had generously posted all my concerts on her website ChristianGays.com, & when they did a search for Sandy Cove Campground, that's where they were directed. They asked me to take the concert off the internet. I explained, of course, that once something is on the internet it's...out! But I really prayed about the request. Let me tell you some of my thinking.

First of all, had it been a concert that was open to the public in the first place I would never have considered taking it down. But it was all along a private booking. Second, we still had not done the concert yet & had not shared any of our own testimonies & I felt like it was important that they not just ask us to leave. I also felt for Shelley, who was very surprised that these people who know her & her wife, would not be welcoming. She had gone to great lengths to bring them what she thought would be a happy surprise. She believed they loved & accepted her just as she is & I felt like it would break her heart to have them ask us to leave. Third, I know Mary at ChristianGays & I knew she would be happy to help in any way she could.

I'm still not sure I made the right decision. You know, speaking of "Biblical beliefs," the BIBLE says that it is when we "walk in the light, as He (Jesus) is in the light" THAT'S when we have fellowship one with the other & the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses every sin. SO...I really try to walk in the light. But on the other side, we were able to do the concert & share stories & some of the women heard just what they needed to hear. One spoke to me for almost an hour afterward about one of her kids who is gay & how grateful she was to have some understanding of "Christian Gays!" Even after all this time, it still feels like it's three steps forward, two steps back. I work with so many people who just *cannot* imagine that being LGBTQ & Christian is still an issue.

Happily, the Green Church was *extremely* welcoming to us. Pastor Jeri gave us the whole service, so I was able to sing, share, do a song with Cindy AND have Cindy preach. She really was great. Dressed all in black with a beautiful short rainbow-colored stole...& bright pink socks. Pray for all the sweet people who heard the message – & have Cindy come preach at your church!! The Green Church really outdid themselves in hospitality. I was very glad to see that Shelley and Terri have a home where they are wanted!
