Winter Moratorium Ends

After April 1, 2019, we do not have to post your premise with a 24-hour disconnect notice. Disconnection may occur immediately. Due dates and disconnect dates will be strictly enforced.

In order to avoid disconnection of your electric service, the past due balance must be paid in full no later than April 1, 2019, or request a reasonable payment agreement for that past due account balance.

Welcome Back Reception a Success for Electric Cooperatives and Legislators

January 15, 2019 - Over 150 Rural Power advocates (managers, staff, and directors) were present for the "Welcome Back" Iowa Legislators and staff in Des Moines on the second night of the 2019 legislative session. The reception is co-hosted by Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives, partnering with and Iowa Institute for Cooperatives, Iowa Communications Alliance, Iowa Biotechnology Association, and Petroleum Marketers and Convenience Stores of Iowa. Nearly 100 legislators and policymakers joined Iowa's electric cooperatives for conversation of important priority issues and food.

During the legislative session there will be discussion of many issues including Iowa's rural economy. Iowa's Rural Electric Cooperatives are important advocates in addressing energy issues allowing member-owned electric cooperatives to continue to provide safe, reliable, affordable, and environmentally responsible power to more than 650,000 Iowans. Electric cooperative representatives across Iowa will visit the state capitol during session to visit with their legislators once again. Annually, REC Day on the Hill is scheduled for March 20, 2019 at the capitol in Des Moines.

Statement of Nondiscrimination
