Study Questions

1). What did Jesus teach His disciples after His resurrection and how would we know?

a). What is significant about the length of time in which He did this?

b). Read 1 Corinthians 15:6 – what do we learn from this verse?

c). Read Luke 24:25-27 + 44-45 – What connection do you think there is between these verses and the Lord's post resurrection teaching?

2). After the Lord's resurrection and before His ascension He commissioned His 'disciples' with respect to a specific task – Let's look at how this commission is presented –

a). Read Matthew 28:18-20 – What according to these verses are the disciples to do and what can we learn from what they are told to?

b). Read Mark 16:15-18 – According to these verses what are the ‘disciples’ to do?

c). What do these verses in Mark add to those from Matthew?

d). What additional information is given in these verses that we don’t see in Matthew?

e). Read Luke 24:46-48 – What verses come right before these?

f). What do these verses in Luke add to our understanding of what we have seen in Matthew and Mark?

g). What additional information is given in these verses that we don’t see in Matthew and Mark?

h). Read Acts 1:8 – What is confirmed in this verse that we saw in Luke and what is added to that which we have already seen in Matthew, Mark and Luke?

i). Looking at Acts 1:8 again, what is the progression of events that was supposed to unfold?

j). What was the message that was to be preached ‘to all nations’ and how do we know?

3). Read Isaiah 43:1 + 10-12 and Jonah 1:1-3 – What do we learn from these verses?

a). Read Acts 2:5 - So, putting this together, why did the message the disciples were commissioned to give have to begin at Jerusalem?

b). Read Jonah 2:7-10 + 3:1-3 + Genesis 45:26a – How do these verses help us understand what should have taken place when the day of Pentecost had fully come?
