Study Questions

1). Read Ephesians 2:8-9 – What is the connection between grace, faith and works in these verses?

a). Read James 2:21-22 and 1 Peter 1:13 – Putting these 2 verses together what is the connection between, grace, faith and works?

b). Are, grace, faith and works the only means by which salvation, past, present and future, is accomplished? Why would this be?

2). Reade James 2:14 -26 – What do we learn about faith and works in these verses?

a). Read Romans 4:1-4 – Do these verses contradict those we just read in James? If not how are we to understand them?

3). What work could we have ever done that would have brought about our eternal salvation? Would this also have to be true for the salvation of our soul?

4). Read Genesis 19:13 + 23 – Did the angels destroy the cities of the plain or did God destroy them?

5). Read Deuteronomy 7:21-24 – What had God told both generations of Israel concerning the land and what were they to do this information?

a). What did the first generation do at Kadesh Barnea and how is their action described in Numbers Chapter 15?

b). Where is the NT parallel for these verses from Numbers?

c). What happened with the first generation the day after their refusal to enter the land?

d). Read Hebrews 11:30-31 – What do we learn about the second generation when it was their turn to enter the land?

6). Read 1 Samuel 17:4-7 + 33 – What contrast is drawn between Goliath and David?

a). What verses show us why this was never a contest?

b). Who killed Goliath?

c). So, trying to put all this together – the angels at Sodom, Joshua at Jericho, David with Goliath – Whose work was it that was done and how was that work accomplished?

d). What are we to learn from this about our works that will be judged at the Judgment Seat?

e). How are the works we are to do to be accomplished? And where do we see these described in 1 Corinthians Chapter 3?

f). How should we understand the works of wood, hay and straw?
