Study Questions

1). How many major warnings are there in the Book of Hebrews and who are these warnings given to? How would we know?

a). What is the central focus of all the warnings?

b). By selecting a scripture for each one, briefly explain what we learn from the first 3 warnings?

2). Read Hebrews 5:9-14 – What imagery is used in these verses to describe the process of becoming mature in the faith?

a). According to these verses, what is the 'strong meat' of the word?

b). How should we understand what it means to go from milk to strong meat and can you think of an example that would illustrate this?

c). What do you think is necessary in our engagement with the Scriptures for us to move beyond the letter to the Spirit?

d). Read 2 Corinthians 3:5-6 – Why does the letter kill, but the Spirit give life?

e). How do you think knowing this might impact how we read our Bible?

3). Read 1 John 1:7-9 – What are we to learn from these verses?

a). How does that which we see here in John connect with what the Lord taught His disciples on the night of the last supper?

b). Which verses from Hebrews Chapter 10 did we look at that talk about this same thing?

4). Read Heb 10:24-27 – According to these verses, what is the purpose for Christians to assemble together?

a). What impact should this have on what we do on Sunday, Wednesday and Thursday?

b). How should this impact our personal interactions at these times?

c). What might stand in the way of us doing this?

d). Why should we do this ‘so much the more as we see the Day approaching’?

e). What do you think the connection might be between the reason we are to assemble together and the willful sin?
