Study Questions

1). Read Hebrews 10:19-22 – What is the 'Holiest'?

a). In the Tabernacle in the wilderness, what would be found there?

b). How is entering the 'Holiest' described in 1 John 1:7?

c). Now, we don't literally enter into the Holiest in the Heavenly Tabernacle when we confess our sin, so, how should we understand being in the light as He is in the light? [Think about what's in the Holiest. Think about John 1:14 and Psalm 119:105]

d). Read James 1:21 – Do you see a connection here with confessing our sin and how does this fit with the answer to the last question?

2). Read Hebrews 9:11-14 – Why can't sin be forgiven without a sacrifice for that sin? Can you think of a Scripture that shows this?

a). What do you understand about a sin for which there is no sacrifice?

3). Read Numbers 15:27-31 – What is the difference between the unintentional sin and the presumptuous sin?

a). How does the person committing the presumptuous sin bring reproach upon the Lord? And what is the consequence for this?

b). Which verses give us an account of presumptuous sin and what should we learn from them?

c). Where do we see this sin with the first generation of Israel and again at the Lord's first advent?

d). What is at the heart of the sin in Numbers and Matthew Chapter 12?

e). Read Numbers 15:30 - 31 again. Now compare this with Hebrews 6:4-6 and Hebrews 10:29 – What do you see?

f). What is the connection between the presumptuous sin, falling away and the willful sin?

g). What, in your own words, is the willful sin and what word do we use to describe those who commit it?

h). Read Jude 1:5-8 – What do these verses teach us about apostates?

i). Which verses did we look at to show us the outcome for those who apostatize? And what did Paul have to say about this?

j). How does Esau fit into all this?
