Study Questions

1). Read Hebrews 11:1-5 – Why is the salvation of the soul the only salvation that can be seen in these verses? [Think particularly about context]

2). Read Genesis 4:3-6 and Hebrews 11:4 – What do the first 3 words in Hebrews 11:4 tell us about what we read in Genesis 4?

a). What event did we look at that parallels that seen in Genesis 4 and what is the connection between the two?

b). Look at the end of Hebrews 11:4 again – How does Abel still speak through his sacrifice?

c). Who do Cain and Abel picture?

d). How does the account of Cain and Abel parallel the account of Israel and Christ at the Lord's first advent?

3). Read Genesis 5:21-24 and Hebrews 11:5-6 – How do we know that Enoch had faith to the saving of the soul?

a). In what other place do we find a reference to Enoch and what is contained in these verses?

b). What do we learn about Enoch from the beginning of Jude 1:14 and why is this significant?

c). What does Enoch's being taken alive into heaven picture for us?

d). How do we reconcile the fact that Enoch had faith to the saving of the soul, but not all Christians, at the time of the resurrection/rapture, will have this type of faith?

4). Read Genesis 4:25 and Genesis 5:1-3 – What parallel is there between Seth and Abel?

5). Read Hebrews 11:7 – How many generations from Adam is Noah?

a). From the beginning of v7, what do we learn about Noah's faith to the saving of the soul?

b). What does the account of Noah provide the type for?

c). According to the type in the account of Jonah, Israel must be 'cast into the sea' and yet Noah is kept 'apart from the sea' in the type he presents. How do we reconcile these 2 things?

d). What is the prophetic panorama presented from Abel to Noah?

e). How is this same prophetic panorama confirmed for us in the Book of the Revelation?
